Council seeks drainage cures

Prior to undertaking their second study of a budget for the next year, the city council passed a resolution establishing Lake Iowa Park as the only legal location within the city where fireworks can be set off.

The resolution included the period of June 24 through July 4 when Independence Day celebrators are allowed to set off fireworks any where within the city, which otherwise is prohibited by city ordinance.

As had been requested previously by council members, the cost of three projects providing for improved water drainage was received.

And aldermen expressed shock at the figures provided by the city's engineering consultant Kerry Maroney.

The projects included drainage improvement on Second Street, Texowa Street, and Douglas Street.

Prior to making a detailed study of correcting the three areas of problems, Maroney estimated the total would be \$1,582,125.

But, after making a detailed study of the areas, his corrected estimate increased to \$3,166,875.

One of the major reasons for the increased cost, Maroney explained, was the skyrocketing price of concrete that has developed in the area, due to so much construction in the Wichita Falls area.

"We ain't got a million and a half for projects," exclaimed Alderman Wayne House. "Maybe we can just dig an open ditch, instead of using a culvert, along Texowa."

Mayor Tim Hunter concluded that it might be possible to use an

open ditch approach on all three projects, and stretch the program over a three-year period.

Maroney said the cost of open ditches would possibly cut the total price to about 25 percent of the esti-

mate.

City Administrator Mike Price proposed the council not hold another budget study until early in August, at which time estimated tax revenue should be available.

School board changes two administrative jobs

More administrative positions were filled during a called meeting of the school board Thursday night.

Debra Brandt was named principal of Kidwell Elementary School, and Weldon Nelms was appointed assistant principal at high school as well as retaining his position as Athletic Director.

Brandt, who has been assistant principal at the middle school the past five years, said "I'm excited about being given the opportunity to go back to Kidwell and working with that age group."

She taught at Kidwell 11 years, four as a first grade teacher and seven as a second grade teacher, before going to the middle school.

Brandt received her BS degree in Elementary Education at Tarleton State University, and her masters and mid-management degrees at Midwestern State University.

She is married to George Brandt, who teaches the Career class at Iowa Park High School. They have two daughters, Amber, a sophomore at MSU, and Ashley, who will be a sophomore at IPHS.

Brandt is filling the position left open when former Kidwell principal, Steve Moody, was named principal of W.F. George Middle School. With Brandt's move, the assistant principal's position at the middle school needs to be filled.

In addition to personnel, board members also dealt with details and scheduling for the sale of bonds and preliminary facility plans.

The school district's financial advisor, Murphy Davis, went over

the procedures involved in the sale of bonds. Bid sheets will be going out to everyone making inquiries, and sealed bids will be opened at a meeting of the school board at 6:30 p.m., July 15, in the school administration building.

Architects Mike Marrs and Bob Weaver discussed preliminary facility plans with the trustees and pointed out where construction would be located on each campus.

Their next step will be meeting with campus committees to determine what's needed in the classrooms.

Nelms is appointed assistant principal

A couple of major changes are in the future for Iowa Park High's coaching staff and administration, announced this week.

Weldon Nelms has been assigned as the Dean of Students at the high school, a position more commonly recognized as assistant principal in charge of discipline.

Nelms will retain the title of Athletic Director and head football coach through the fall.

In the spring, Chris Ellis, who has been the offensive coordinator in football, will assume the title of head football coach beginning the spring semester.

It has not yet been determined whether there will be a change in who will be the Athletic Director, Alan Seay, high school principal, said.

"It's a career move, a new challenge," Nelms stated, adding that he is currently working on completing his administrative certification and will be working under an emergency certification until that is completed.

Nelms admitted he was making the change with mixed emotions, commenting, "I've got a great group of guys and ladies working together, keeping a program of consistency."

Ellis admitted he had sought a head coaching position at other schools, adding that Nelms "kept me on. He told me to hang in. This is a

good situation. We've got things going pretty good."

"I think it's going to be great," Principal Seay stated. "We want continued respect to be put on administration, and it will help us become a top-notch school."

Seay added that Dennis Brooks will also continue as assistant principal, and be in charge of truancy.

Ellis, who has worked under Nelms 10 years, said he wanted to continue as head coach in track next spring, "to see if I can handle it with the time constraints," he added.

One of the major changes facing Ellis is the fact that he's coming in right at the time the University Interscholastic League makes its realignment of schools, and also the duties of scheduling games for the following two years.

Nelms said he has assigned Tim Bartram to cover the coaching duties of the golf team, a position vacated by David May's resignation.

Two new coaches have also been hired, including Dusty Robinson at the high school and Micky Hughes at junior high.

Two posts remain unfilled, including assistant basketball and baseball that May filled, as well as junior high girls' coach which is opening with the resignation of Joyce Smith.

Summer has wet beginning

Summer ordinarily is the dry season around Iowa Park, but this year it's been a wet period.

Monday, according to the calendar, was the first day of summer,

and Iowa Park was washed with .56 of an inch.

Then, another .63 was measured by Virgil Woodsin on Tuesday, raising summer's thus-far total to 1.19.

Letter carriers pack in the food

Iowa Parkans contributed their second-highest amount during the recent Letter Carrier Food Drive.

Local carriers reported picking up 2,650 pounds of food during the project, second only to the first drive

in 1995, when 3,400 was collected.

Total poundage donated by local residents since the carriers began their project is 12,215.

The food collected is turned over to the Wichita Falls Area Food Bank.

Local man injured in wreck

A one-vehicle accident early Sunday morning critically injured Patrick Sargent, 31, of Iowa Park.

Sargent was travelling east on US 287 about seven miles east of Vernon when his vehicle left the road, missing a guard rail, and went up a steep embankment at the overpass of FM 433.

The Jaws of Life were used to extract Sargent from the pickup.

Vernon EMS transported

Sargent to Wilbarger General Hospital in Vernon, then transferred him to the intensive care unit at United Regional Health Care Center 11th Street Campus in Wichita Falls.

Sargent underwent several hours of surgery Sunday to repair numerous facial injuries. Plans were being made Wednesday to transfer him to Fort Worth for surgery to repair an eye and a broken sternum.

At presstime, Sargent was listed in serious but stable condition.

Pecan Crispies

- 1/2 cup shorting
- 1/2 cup butter
- 2 1/2 cups brown sugar
- 2 beaten eggs
- 2 1/2 cups flour
- 1/2 tsp. soda
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1 cup chopped pecans

Cream shorting, butter, and sugar thoroughly. Add eggs; beat well. Sift dry ingredients; add to creamed mixture. Add pecans. Drop by spoonfuls about two inches apart onto greased cookie sheet.

Bake at 350 degrees 12 to 15 minutes. Makes five dozen.

Chasen's and Baxter's Famous Chili

- 1/2 lb. pinto beans
- 5 cups tomatoes (I usually use half Rotel)
- 1 lb. green peppers (chopped)
- 1 1/2 Tbs. oil
- 1 1/2 lbs. onions (chopped)
- 2 cloves garlic (crushed)
- 1/2 cup minced parsley
- 1/4 cup oleo
- 2 1/2 lbs. ground chuck
- 1 lb. ground lean pork
- 1/3 cup chili powder
- 2 tbs. salt
- 1 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 1/2 tsp. cumin seed

Wash beans and place in pan and soak overnight. Simmer one to two hours.

Add tomatoes and simmer five minutes longer. While beans are cooking, saute green pepper in oil five minutes. Add onions and cook until tender. Add garlic and parsley.

In another skillet, melt butter, add beef and pork and saute about 15 minutes or until brown.

Add meat mixture to the beans and season with salt, pepper and cumin seed.

Simmer uncovered one hour. Cover and continue cooking 30 minutes, stirring now and then and adding water to keep moistened. Skim fat from surface and serve.

Jo's Tortilla Bars

- 8 oz. cream cheese
- 8 oz. picante sauce
- 1 small can black olives
- 2 cups shredded cheese
- flour tortillas

Mix all above ingredients; spread on tortilla. Roll up and re-

frigerate. Before serving cut into bite size pieces.

Hershey Bar Pie

- 1 - 16 ounce almond Hershey bar
- 3 - cups miniature marshmallows
- 2 tsps. gelatin (unflavored)
- 2/3 cups milk
- 2 cups whipping cream
- 2 baked pie crusts

Sprinkle gelatin over room temperature milk, let set 10 minutes.

In double boiler, melt chocolate bar and marshmallows. Add gelatin and stir until dissolved.

Set aside to cool.

Beat cream until stiff. Fold into melted chocolate mixture until well combined.

Pour into prepared crusts. Makes two pies.

Los Mochis' Sopa de Tortilla (Tortilla Soup)

- 10 tortillas (cut in julienne strips)
- 1/4 cup oil
- 1 green pepper (cut in strips)
- 2 tomatoes (peeled and chopped)
- 1 onion (minced)
- 1 or 2 avocados, depending on size, (chopped)
- 1/2 tsp. cumin
- 2 Tbsp. cilantro
- 8 cups chicken broth
- 2 cups cooked chicken (diced)
- 1/2 cup Monterey Jack or casino brick cheese, cut in 1/4 inch cubes.
- Salt to taste
- Sour cream

Fry tortillas in oil, adding more oil if needed, until golden brown. Drain on paper towels. Saute onion and garlic in same oil.

Add chicken broth and chopped chicken. Add salt and seasonings. Bring to boil about five minutes. Divide tortilla strips, chopped tomatoes, avocados and cheese among six bowls and pour boiling soup over them. Top with sour cream.

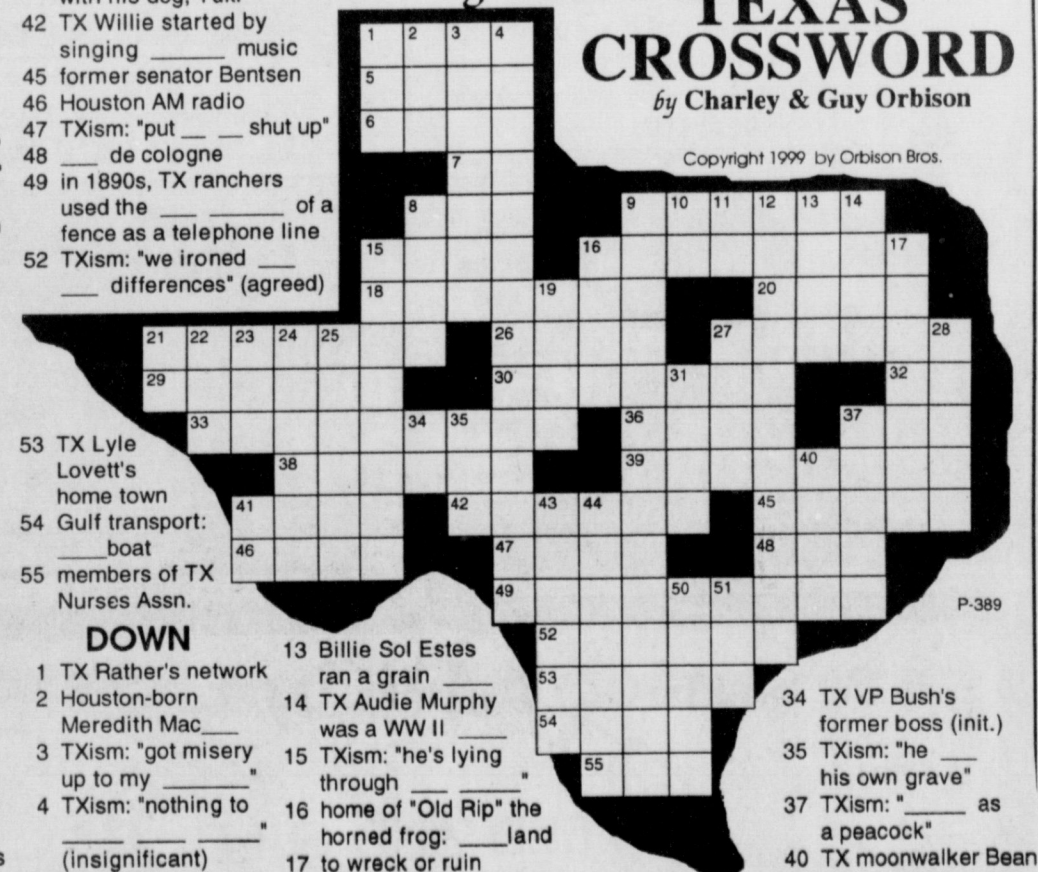

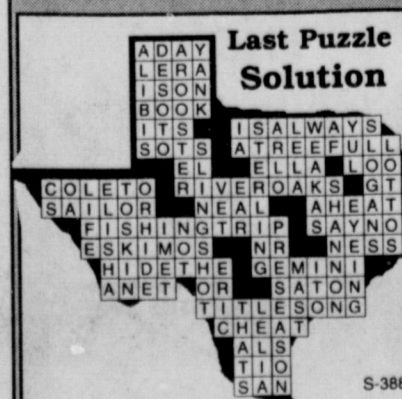

The trip was well worth it, even the chore of having to drive with all the traffic through Houston... while it was raining heavily.

To say Moody Gardens is unique would be an understatement.

They have one of the most beautiful hotels I've ever seen, just for a base. And of the hundreds of hotels we've stayed, I've never seen a more courteous staff of employees, from bell hops to management.

The swimming pool at the hotel is unusual in its design, very handy, and has lots of seating and sunbathing furniture... along with waiters to bring your refreshments!

And they live up to their name of "gardens," because the grounds are unlike anything I've ever seen. And they have a small army of workers busy throughout each day, planting, attending, cleaning and re-planting.

But these are only the foundation points of Moody Gardens.

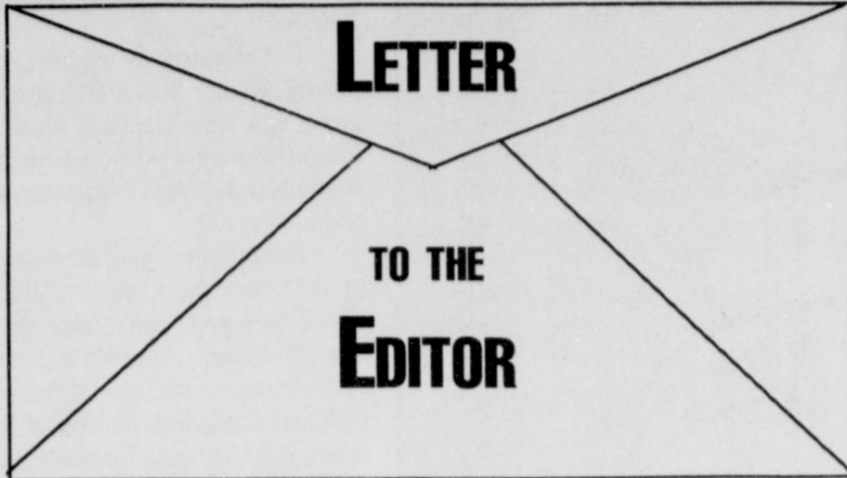
There are two pyramid structures on the grounds, constructed of metal frames with glass. Both are some 130 feet in height. One is an aquarium, and the other holds a rain forest.

To supplement all this, they have two unique theaters, and are about to open an ice skating rink.

All these major features are about a block from the hotel, and well within walking distance.

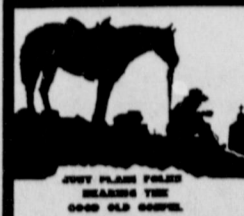

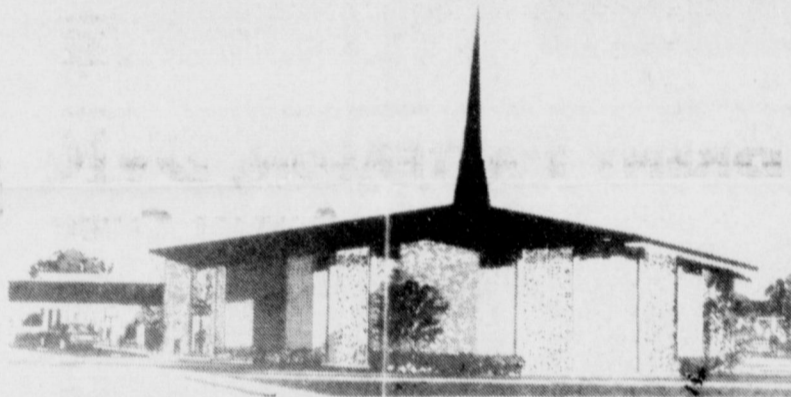

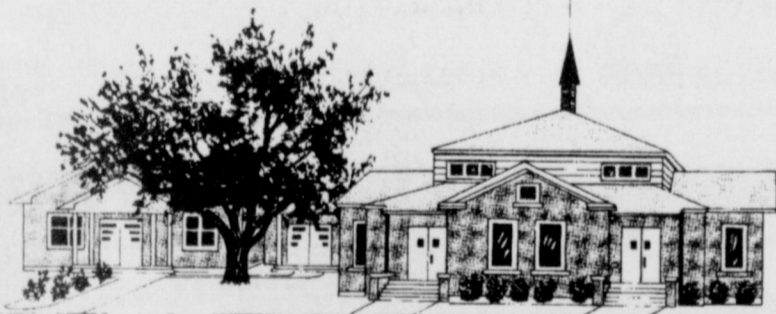

WHAT DOES GOD SAY?

About covetousness? Covetousness is a sin seldom recognized or acknowledged. Jesus uses the word in Luke 12:15, meaning "a greedy desire to have more." The word "covet" means "to lust after," or "of those who seek things forbidden." Still another variation of the word is defined as "loving money, avarice." Of all sins, this has to be among the most common. Jeremiah said of Israel, "everyone of them is given to covetousness, and from the prophet even to the priest everyone dealt falsely" (Jer. 6:13).

How serious is this sin? Covetousness is a form of idolatry. "Mortify therefore your members which are upon the earth; fornication, uncleanness, inordinate affection, evil concupiscence, and covetousness, which is idolatry" (Colossians 3:5). In Ephesians 5:3, it is listed with other sins such as "uncleanness" which is defined as "the impurity of lustful, luxurious, profligate living." "Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whispers" (Romans 1:29). "Nor thieves, nor covetous, nor drunkards, nor revilers, nor extortioners, shall inherit the kingdom of God" (1 Corinthians 6:10). "For this ye know, that now whoremonger, nor unclean person, nor covetous man, who is an idolater, hath any inheritance in the kingdom of Christ and of God" (Ephesians 5:5). "For men shall be lovers of their own selves, covetous..." (2 Timothy 3:2)

How has this sin affected our nation? We have taught ourselves and our children that self gratification is most important. But God says "...in lowliness of mind let each esteem other better than themselves." Personal greed has destroyed human relationships, families. Divorce rates soar, and live-in arrangement replace marriage for selfish interests. Children are left to roam the streets, denied the guidance and discipline of loving parents because of the greed for luxury and self satisfaction. We have taught our girls to be career minded at the expense of "loving their husbands," being "keepers at home" (Titus 2:5) and mothers to their children, defending the ability to do both while failure after failure is evident. Our young men grow up doing as they please, often with no real sense of being loved (Proverbs 29:15). The few who would be good parents are afraid of someone shouting "abuse!" if they exercise appropriate discipline. And we ask, how can parents not see Columbine events coming? Mothers and fathers often cannot see their children because they are too occupied with their own interests. Covetousness! Taking away guns isn't going to correct the problem of immature children, frustrated with a life they don't know what to do with and that no one else will sacrifice enough to help. In a nation gloating over economic prosperity, covetousness is destroying us! Jesus said, "beware of covetousness."

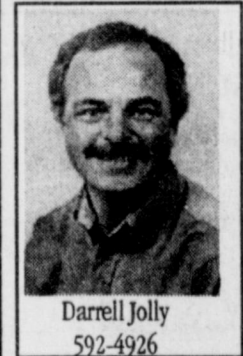
