Emergency training exercise is Saturday

An urgent call has been made for volunteers to participate Saturday morning in a disaster training drill.

Mayor Tim Hunter said Monday only about half the number of volunteers needed for the drill have contacted city hall.

The event will require only three hours of volunteer time, he said. It is to begin at 9 a.m. and conclude by 12-noon.

The training will be for virtually every emergency response group in Wichita County, as well as personnel from several businesses including

Cryovac and the railroad.

Though the type of disaster has not been disclosed, volunteers will be "labeled" as to what their "injuries" involve requiring attention of the responders.

Officials have said that the city's emergency sirens would not be sounded if heavy clouds are overhead, but if they are high, scattered clouds the sirens would be sounded to call out the responders.

Volunteers wishing to participate can call City Hall, at 592-2131 and leave their names.

Chamber planning for major activities

The second annual ParkFest event planning indicate this year's observance will be considerably larger and more enjoyable than the inaugural event.

Reporting during Monday's monthly Chamber of Commerce board of directors' meeting, chairman Ken Via told of numerous activities leading to that conclusion.

For the past month, committee members have been gathering every two weeks to plan the event, which is held at Lake Gordon.

ParkFest will be held on May 13, and non-profit organizations wishing to reserve the same type booths they had last year should make their reservations with the Chamber by April 1.

He reported that a "full-blown" car show will be a major feature, as well as an antique tractor show. Additionally, there could possibly be scheduled a barbecue cookoff that

would be sanctioned.

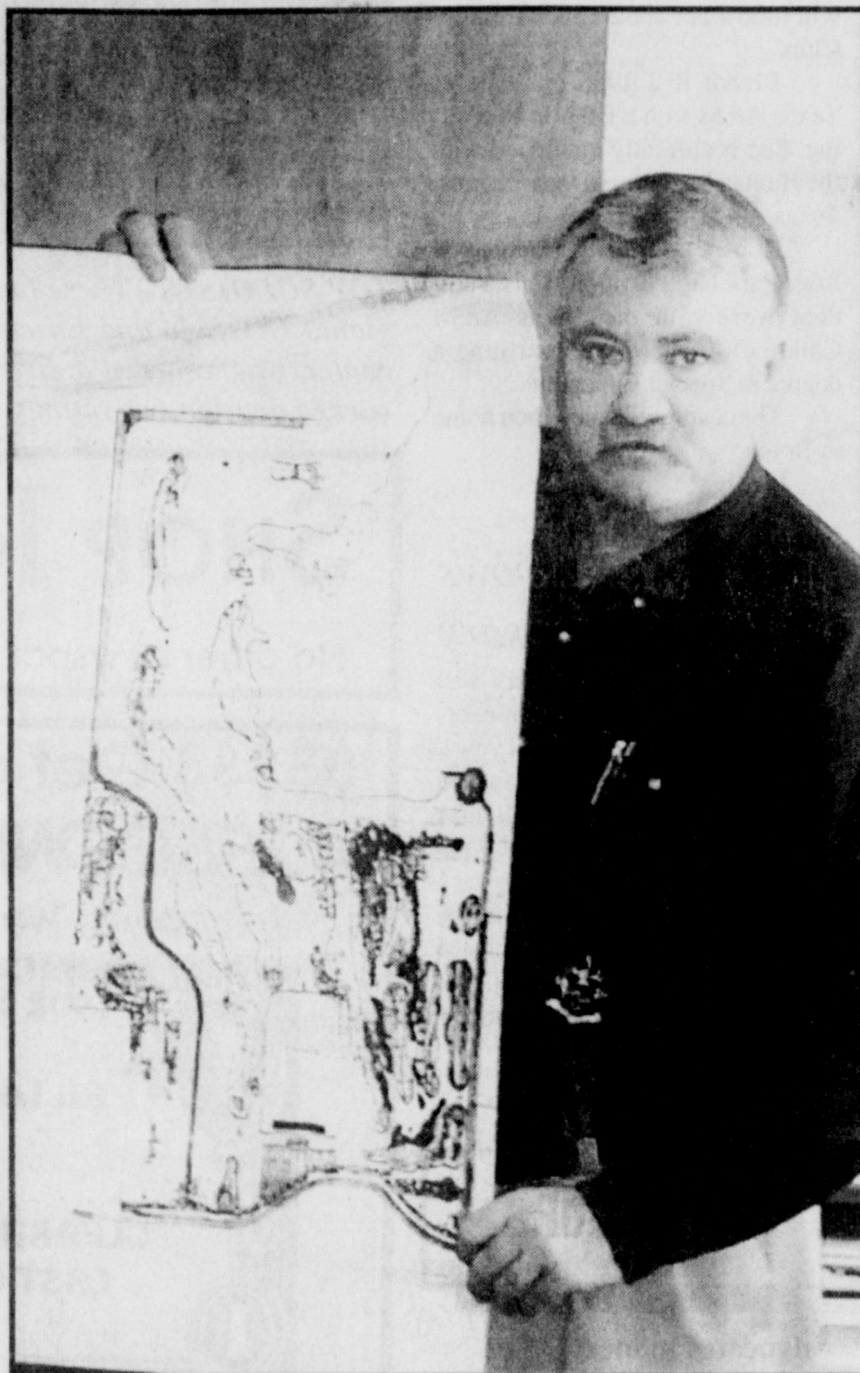
This year's activities will not begin until 10 a.m., however, instead of the 9 a.m. start that was slated last year.

Via encouraged all businesses to include a promotion in the event along with their monthly billings.

Other events planned by the Chamber this year include: City-Wide Clean-Up Week, Mar. 27 to April 2; City-Wide Yard Sale, Apr. 1; and the annual All-Iowa Park Golf Tournament, June 2.

Chamber President Mike Price encouraged all members to write letters to their elected state and federal officials, encouraging them to vote against a proposal to continue not charging sales tax on internet purchases.

He explained that the loss, not only to Iowa Park but all communities, would be expensive as such purchasing increases, and would also lead to increased property taxes.

18-hole golf course closer to reality

A long sought-after golf course for Iowa Park is becoming more of a possibility than every before.

The city has been approached by Iowa Parkan Keith Rusk with a proposal to lease city-owned land on which to develop a full, 18-hole course.

And city council members have given their unofficial approval of the proposal.

Rusk is requesting a 99-year lease from the city, to build the course on land recently purchased from Gene Wigley, plus 35 additional acres on the west side of Lake Iowa Park.

His proposal includes his investment of \$1,400,000 to develop the facility.

In addition, Rusk proposes to use up to 30 acres of the property to develop housing, which would be located on 90x120 foot lots, with a 50-foot right of way that would include paved street, drainage and utilities. There would be as many as 82 housing lots developed.

The course would be developed under the trained eye of Clark Waters, who received specialized training at Texas Tech Univ., and the homes constructed by contractor Jim Stevens.

All three of the men who would

be involved were raised and educated here in Iowa Park.

Rusk agrees to begin construction on the course within 90 days from the signing of the lease, as well as paying the city \$1 for each green fee charged to the public.

The proposal includes an agreement, when signed, for the city to buy back the completed golf facility, should it fail, at a rate of 50-cents on the \$1 investment, with the total to not exceed \$500,000.

Upon completion of the infrastructure improvements, Rusk would deed back to the city the street right of way in the housing development.

However, before such an agreement can be signed, approval by public vote would be required, aldermen were told.

City Administrator Mike Price told the council Monday night that Attorney Jay Cantrell interprets the law to require public approval of any such use of public-owned land.

The council utilized a work session Monday night to discuss Rusk's proposal.

Price said if the council approves Rusk's offering at the Mar. 13 council meeting, the issue could be put on the May 6 city council election ballot.

Hundreds of athletes to be here Saturday

More than 1,000 athletes are expected to converge at Hawk Stadium Saturday, for the annual running of the Iowa Park Lions Club Hawk Relays.

This year's event has attracted participants from both Texas and Oklahoma schools.

Competition will begin at 8:30 a.m., and other than a brief break for lunch, continue until the final races which are to get underway at 4:30 p.m.

Three divisions have been set up for boys and two for girls.

Division I, for 4A and 5A boys, has drawn teams from Altus, Burkburnett, Hirschi, Lawton High, Lawton Ike, Lawton MacArthur, Norman High, Norman North and Wichita Falls High.

Division II, for boys 2A and 3A, plus 4A and 5A junior varsities, will be Archer City, Burkburnett JV, Electra, Gainesville, Hirschi JV, Holliday, Iowa Park, Lawton Ike JV, Marlow, Norman North JV, Seymour, Vernon and Wichita Falls High JV.

In Division III, 1A boys and all other junior varsities, will include Bellevue, Chillicothe, City View JV, Electra JV, Harold, Holliday JV, Iowa

Park JV, Petrolia, Petrolia JV, Seymour JV, Vernon JV and Vernon Northside.

Division IV, girls 3A, 4A and 5A, has attracted teams from Borger, Burkburnett, Gainesville, Iowa Park, Lawton High, Lawton Ike, Lawton MacArthur, Marlow, Norman High, Norman North, Vernon and Wichita Falls High.

The largest division is Div. V, girls 1A, 2A and all Junior Varsities, including Archer City, Bellevue, Borger JV, Chillicothe, City View JV, Electra, Harold, Holliday, Iowa Park JV, Norman North JV, Paradise, Seymour, Seymour JV, Vernon Northside and Wichita Falls JV.

Boys field events will be the first competition, beginning at 8:30, with girls field events starting at 11:30.

Girls running event preliminaries will start at 8:30 and continue until 10:15, followed by all boys running event preliminaries.

At 1:00, the special presentation of the Hawk Track Hall of Fame will take place, and that will be followed at 1:15 by the "fat boys relay" event.

Finals in all running events will get underway at 1:30.

Watkins to be inducted

The late Pete Watkins will be inducted into the Hawk Track Hall of Fame during a 1 p.m. ceremony Saturday in Hawk Stadium.

Watkins, who died Dec. 17, 1999, would have been so honored earlier, had the members of the sponsoring Iowa Park Lions Club been aware of his exploits some 60 years ago.

Members of Watkins' family are to be here to receive a plaque in his honor. Additionally, his name will be installed on an individual bronze plaque at the base of the main flag pole at Hawk Stadium.

Not only was he outstanding in high school, but competing for Texas A&M Univ., and then in the U.S. Army.

Honored previously were: the late Bobby Gilbreath, 1995; Erica Knight, 1996; Robert Nolen, 1997; Tony Waters, 1998, and Kerri Dornier Vajnar, 1999.

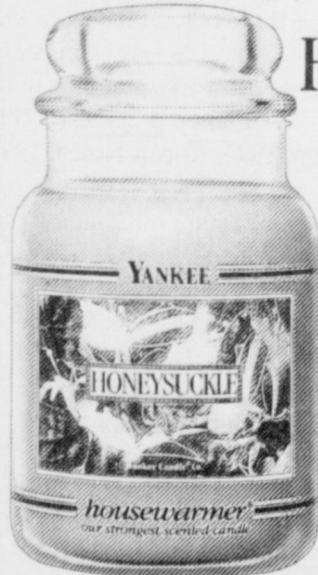

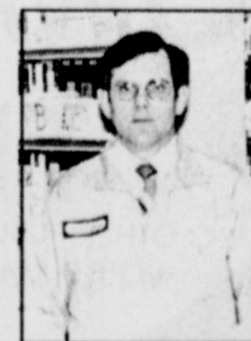
