## Major water problem averted here Thursday

What could have been a real disaster for the residents of Iowa Park turned out to be an outpouring of community support.

Thursday of last week, at about 4:45 p.m., a construction worker laying fiber optic cable cut into the city's water main 3/4 of a mile east of Iowa Park.

The water line, a 16-inch steel line encased in concrete, was cut clear through and an eight-to-10 inch chunk cut out of it.

By 5:30 p.m. the police were driving the streets asking people to stop watering their yards and gardens.

The Iowa Park Fire Department and Lady's Auxiliary also hit the streets seeking out those watering their yards and grass.

The police department called in two extra officers and Police Chief, Lynn Collins cruised the streets.

Price said, "Everyone they spoke with was understanding and discontinued watering. The response of the citizens, firemen, the auxiliary and city employees was tremendous. Everyone was willing to help."

Just when the police, fire and city crews thought everything was under control, the unthinkable happened. A house fire.

At 8:57 p.m. the fire department

were dispatched to Sue McKnight's home at 700 E. Washington.

The fire was reported only minutes after a waterline in the 1200 block of South Wall began spewing water about eight inches out of the ground.

The city's water contractor, Monty Britt, had all of his employees working on the main water leak and could not spare anyone to work on the Wall Street line.

Mike Price, City Administrator, jumped to action and began to do some dirty work.

He located a front end loader at the city's street department and contacted two street department employees, Calvin Fowler and Freddy Smith, and went to work.

Price said, "It might have taken us a little longer, but the line was repaired by 11:30. And it was repaired with the line under pressure."

Because the work was done with the line under pressure the residents of Garden Valley were not without water.

While Price, Fowler and Smith were working on the line, residents in the neighborhood began offering to help. Before long a young man was holding a flashlight, another was operating the fire plug to release pressure off of the busted line, and others

were doing whatever was needed.

Price said, "It was almost fun, seeing the community pull together and prevent a real problem. Fowler and Smith didn't bat an eye when they were asked to help with the water line. They just went to work and that's not even their area."

At 2:30 Friday afternoon the water plant had recovered to about 95%. Price expected it to be fully recovered by that evening.

According to Price, the busted lines could have been a real disaster had everyone not been quick to take action. With people watering their yards and gardens in the evening hours, in addition to other water usage, the water towers were lowering rapidly. Even with the residents not watering the lawns the leak on Wall was lowering the towers water level fast.

With the heavy water usages the Iowa Park water plant had almost reached its peak for the day and was about to receive water from the Cypress Water Plant in Wichita Falls when the line burst.

According to Belvin Lytle, Public Works Director, the Iowa Park plant has the ability to process about 1.6 million gallons of water. The state

## Council picks streets to be worked this year

The city council Monday night approved a list of streets to be overlaid with slurry material this summer.

The list, described as "doable" both in time and cost by Administrator Mike Price, includes 35 blocks, at an estimated cost of \$21,500.

No additional resurfacing of any

streets will be scheduled this year, but three streets, including Surrey Circle, North First and West Smith, were discussed as most-needed.

Also approved were all five items on the meeting's agenda. They included:

\* Joe Voyles' request for a water tap to serve his home at 824 Burnett

Ranch Road;

\* A resolution amending the lease agreement with Wichita Falls Celltelco Partnership to continue maintaining its antenna atop the Emerald Street water tower.

The new agreement covers a five-year extension, increasing the monthly fee from \$100 to \$200. Also involved the company's paying the bill for lighting the Johnson Road water tower.

\* A resolution authorizing the city administrator to utilize unbudgeted surplus funds from the water and sewer fund (about \$8,500) to make repairs to the 16-inch water transmission line from Wichita Falls.

\* An ordinance rezoning the 7.44-acre tract of land on West Smith from General Agricultural to Light Industrial. The land reportedly has been purchased by Bell Processing from Cornerstone Pentecostal Church of God, to be used for offices and truck servicing.

The church reportedly is purchasing land on North Pacific, where it plans to construct a new building.

\* Authorized the city administrator to advertise for proposals to

## Police are kept busy

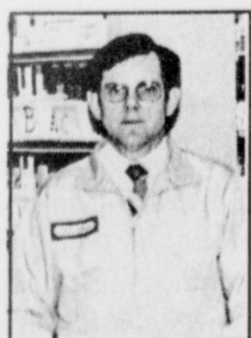

# COOK of the WEEK



Butch Hager

Butch Hager is always looking for a reason to cook. He says, "give me a reason to cook and I'll be there."

He says food brings people together and he likes people.

Hager is just beginning to get involved in the community and says he is looking forward to being an active citizen of Iowa Park and helping when and where his services may be a benefit. He enjoys supporting and helping with fund raisers that will help the community and its residents.

For five years Hager built the sets for the plays put on by the Northside Girls Club and sponsored by the Wichita Falls Junior Senior Forum. While involved in that program he received the Adult Service Award from Northside Girls Club.

He recently furnished the cooker and cooked at the Iowa Park Police Association bar-b-que. He also assisted Pete Ermas and Brent Hrnircik in cooking for the 1998-1999 Iowa Park eighth grade fund-raiser. He has prepared the food for wedding receptions and numerous parties.

Hager designed and built a large smoker that has a unique smoking and heating system.

He explained that the fire box and the smoke stack are both at the same end of the cooker. A plate forces the smoke and heat through the smoker and then back to the smoke stack, causing the entire smoker to be the same temperature from end to end. Hager says because of this system there are no hot spots in the

smoker and he doesn't have to rotate the meat.

He can smoke up to 23 briskets at once in the smoker.

Hager has been a resident of Iowa Park nine years, moving here from Byers. He is employed at Landrum Chevrolet as an Auto Technician.

He moved to Iowa Park seeking a better school and more activities for his three sons to be involved in.

His sons, Kelly and Cody are now grown and Kevin is a senior at Iowa Park High School.

Kelly and Kevin still live at home and Hager says Kevin shares the cooking duties and Kelly is the chief bottle washer.

Hager says when he and Kevin get in the kitchen together there is no telling what they might cook up.

Besides cooking Hager enjoys history especially Texas History. He reads any type of material he can find on history, as well as visits museums and watches movies.

The recipes Hager is sharing are all his own creation, either by altering the recipe or just starting from scratch until he has a good recipe. These recipes were designed for cooking on a gas grill.

Note - Temperatures vary from grill to grill, a meat thermometer and an oven thermometer are very important to insure that the meat is cooked properly.

Temperature	Heat Setting
250 to 300 degrees F	Low
325 to 375 Degrees F	Medium

**400 to 425 Degrees F High**  
Direct heat, cooking directly over flame and lava rock.

Indirect heat, not cooking directly over flame and lava rock.

### Tacos

- 1 lb ground beef
- 1/3 cup chopped onion
- 2 Tbls. finely chopped black olives
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/8 tsp. pepper
- 12 taco shells
- 1/2 cup chopped tomatoes

### Topping

- Guacamole
- Chopped green onions
- Grated cheddar cheese
- Shredded lettuce

Preheat grill 10 minutes. ( If your grill has two burners, cook over one burner only). In a large cast-iron skillet, combine ground beef and onion. Cook and stir at high heat, with hood open, until beef is no longer pink. 10 to 12 minutes. Drain. Stir in olives, cumin, salt, garlic powder and pepper. Place taco shells on upper cooking rack. Cook meat mixture with hood closed for about five minutes longer. Stir in tomatoes. Reduce heat setting to low and serve from grill with toppings.

### Seasoned Tip Roast

- 2 Tbls. dried parsley flakes
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 tsp. dried rosemary leaves
- 1/2 tsp. dried thyme leaves
- 1/4 tsp. ground pepper
- 5 lbs. beef sirloin tip roast
- Cracked pepper
- Hard rolls

In a small bowl, combine and stir together parsley flakes, garlic, rosemary, thyme and ground pepper. Cut about 20 slits in roast, two inches deep and one and a half inches long. Stuff a small amount of mixture into each slit. Tie string around roast in four or five places to pull together the slits so the mixture in slits will not fall out while on the spit. For a stronger flavor, cover and refrigerate for 8 hours.

Remove cooking grid, preheat grill to 325 to 375 degrees F. Center

a drip pan on lava rocks using a set of long tongs.

Rub roast with cracked pepper. Skewer and balance roast on spit. Rotiss at medium (325 to 375) heat until internal temperature is 150 degrees F, about one hour 15 minutes to one and a half hours. Thinly slice and serve with hard rolls.

### Bar - B - Que Hamburgers

- 2 lbs. ground beef
- 4 ounces minced green onion
- 6 ounces spicy barbecue
- 8 thin slices of ham
- 8 slices American cheese
- 8 slices Swiss cheese
- Salt & pepper
- 4 ounces granulated garlic
- 1/2 stick sweet butter

Mix ground meat, onion, and barbecue sauce together, sprinkle on salt and pepper while mixing. Make eight quarter pound, 3/8 inch thick patties. Place patties on cookie sheet covered on top and bottom with foil. Refrigerate prepared patties two hours before cooking.

Preheat grill both sides on high for 10 minutes. Cook meat on high with hood closed until it is seared on one side, then turn. After meat is seared on both sides, open hood. Move meat to one side of grill. Be cautious of flare-ups. Cook meat until there is no pink in center of meat.

Cook ham on other side of grill, when cooked, wrap ham in tin foil

and place on top and bottom of buns. Melt butter in a small pan on top of grid, add garlic, keep stirred when butter is melted. Place pan in the corner of grill, to keep from burning butter.

Apply small amount of butter and garlic with basting brush on open side of top and bottom of buns.

Wire brush grid before placing buns on grid. Set open face of buns on grid until lightly toasted. Turn grill to low, turn over buns, set meat on bottom and add American cheese, ham, swiss cheese and bun top. Keep grill on low and close lid to melt cheese. About one minute. Remove from grill and serve with favorite dressing, lettuce and tomatoes.

### Ring Bologna German Potato Salad

- 5 slices of bacon, chopped
- 1/2 cup chopped onion
- 2 Tbls. all-purpose flour
- 4 tsp. sugar
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3/4 tsp. celery seed
- 1/4 tsp. pepper
- 1 cup distilled water
- 1/3 cup cider vinegar
- 2 tps. Dijon mustard
- 2 lbs. red potatoes, boiled
- 1 ring bologna (about 1 lb.)

Ring sausage can be used instead of bologna.

Wash and peel potatoes. Using a pot large enough to hold potatoes, combine potatoes and two teaspoons of salt with enough water to cover potatoes. Cover pot and remove cooking grid, (use one burner only if equipped) Place pot directly on lava rock grate, arrange rock around pot. Cook on high (400 to 450 degrees) until water boils, reduce to low (250 to 300 degrees) for 15 to 20 minutes then set aside when finished.

In 2 quart grill safe casserole dish or pan, combine bacon and onion. Remove cooking grid and place pan directly on lava rock grate, arrange rock around dish or pan. Cook on Medium - High heat with hood open until bacon is brown and onions are tender, stirring frequently. Stir in

flour, sugar, salt, celery seed and pepper. Add water, vinegar and mustard. Cook and stir with hood open until mixture is bubbly, five to seven minutes.

Remove from grill and set aside. Spread lava rock evenly across grate with long handled tongs. Replace cooking grid. Close hood and heat grill on high for 10 minutes. Slice potatoes, stir into sauce, cover and place onto grid. Score bologna or sausage, at 1 - inch intervals and place besides potatoes on grid.

Cook on High with hood closed for five to six minutes, turning bologna or sausage over at least once.

Reduce heat to medium and place meat in with potatoes. Recover and bake using indirect heat set on medium heat with hood closed until sauce bubbly, 20 to 30 minutes.

## May good for business

May was a good month for businesses in Iowa Park, according to a report from the state comptroller's office.

The city received a sales tax rebate check for \$24,997.51, which was a 33.40-percent increase over July of 1998.

July's sales tax rebate includes local sales taxes collected in May and reported to the comptroller's office in June.

Thus far this year, Iowa Park is

14.80-percent above 1998, having received a total of \$184,786.07. This time last year it was \$160,951.08, according to the report.

All the other three cities in the county also are experiencing gains for the year: Wichita Falls 1.35; Burkburnett 2.67, and Electra a whopping 63.86 percent.

Holiday continues to have less sales taxes collected, and was down 31.79 percent for the month and 30.42 percent for the year, the comptroller reported.

establishes the maximum capacity each water plant is allowed to process in a 24-hour period.

This summer because of the adequate rainfall the city had only taken water once or twice a week until the first of last week, when they began taking water daily.

During the summer months the city takes an average of 400 to 600 thousand gallons daily from the Cypress plant.

#### Bill will clean the air

Dear Mr. Hamilton:

My last letter to you about environmental issues in Texas, in particular our state's air quality was sent several months ago. I am very pleased to be able to tell you about the progress that's been made since then.

I hope you've noticed that the recent legislation that restructures the electric industry in Texas also creates the opportunity to improve air quality by enabling reductions in power plant emissions. TXU strongly believes everybody wins with this legislation because everybody wins with clean air.

The legislation will result in an across the board reduction of 50 percent in nitrogen oxide emissions and a 25 percent reduction in sulfur dioxide emissions from older power plants across the state. The older or so-called "grandfathered," power plants will become much cleaner. These are significant reductions and will be of enormous help, particularly in reducing ozone. However, by themselves they will not solve urban air quality issues. Region VI of the Environmental Protection Agency has modified the air quality rating for Dallas/Ft. Worth from "moderate to

"severe." The region's air quality has improved, but not enough to meet the EPA targets to avoid reclassification. Increased air emissions from our growing economy, including more cars and trucks, more homes and more industry, make air quality improvements more difficult.

In the fall of last year, TXU made the unprecedented move of volunteering to seek permits for all of our older power plants. Furthermore, responding to our customers' requests for renewable energy, we contracted to purchase enough electricity from the Big Spring Wind Farm to power 7,300 homes a year. This project is a strong first step toward bringing "green" power to our customers and is a significant contribution toward new requirements to more than triple Texas' current renewable energy capacity. These initiatives will lead to decreased emissions and cleaner air.

At TXU, we pride ourselves on our commitment to the environment and that is why our company has been one of the industry leaders to improve air quality in Texas. We are dedicated to working with you and other leaders to find additional solutions. Sincerely,

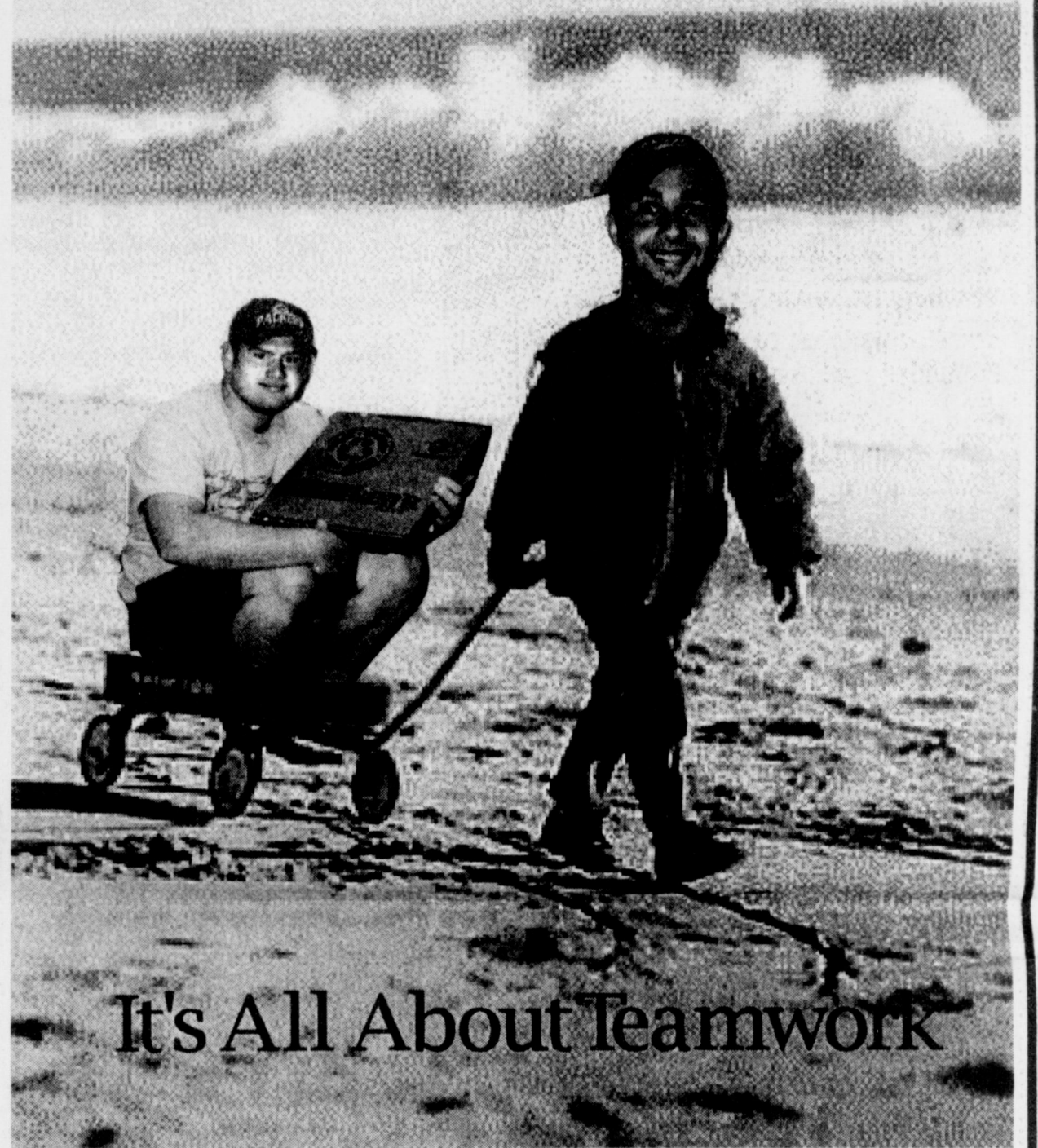
Jerry McWilliams, who was the head line coach of the Hawks when Iowa Park earned back-to-back state football championships in 1969-70, announced his retirement this month.

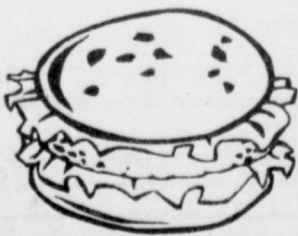
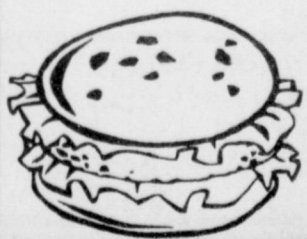
