Hawks hosting Bobcats in first district contest

That big win over Hirschi in week three ... forget about it.

That loss to the Coyotes in week five ... forget about it, because neither of them mean anything as Iowa Park prepares to start what head coach Weldon Nelms calls the "Real Season".

Friday night's District 5-3A opener against defending champion Childress is when the games start counting.

Iowa Park will play host to the Bobcats tomorrow night starting at 7:30 at Hawk Stadium in what looks like a battle for the District Title in week one.

The Hawks and the Bobcats look like the two top teams in District 5-3A, with Vernon falling a bit this year.

Childress comes into the game with a perfect 5-0 record while Iowa Park comes in at 3-2 after falling in their final two games against Gainesville and Wichita Falls High School.

But those records don't carry a lot of weight heading into the district opener, according to Nelms.

"Everybody is starting over now at 0-0," Nelms stated. "It's money time now. We're going to pick up our intensity level and our preparation for our upcoming opponents. This is a big game for us. It's not a must win in the sense that the loser is done for the season, but it is a game we feel we have to win to reach our first goal of winning the District Championship. Iowa Park hasn't done that since 1986 and our kids know that to win it this year, they have to beat the defending champions. We need to come out with a lot of intensity and be ready to play from the word go. I think our kids learned a big lesson in last year's game against Childress. We came out a bit flat and before we knew it we were behind 19-0. Our kids know that this is going to be a tough game. Both teams have very high hopes heading into the district opener. I think it's a big advantage for us to open play at home in the opener. Our crowd needs to get involved in the game and become a factor. They need to give us

that home field advantage, get behind these kids and show them their support."

The 5-0 Bobcats enter the game with wins over Tulia, Holliday, Canadian, Amarillo River Road and West Texas High and have several players back from last year's squad that went several rounds in to the State Playoffs, including one of their very talented running backs in Willie Thomas.

Thomas was joined by Travoy Brown in the Bobcat backfield last season giving Childress a tandem of running backs that was one of the best in the State.

"As Willie Thomas goes, so go the Bobcats," Nelms added. "He's their go-to guy. He's a big, strong runner that always seems to come up with big plays for them. He hurt us last year, scoring a couple of touchdowns and rushing for over 100 yards. But he's not the only weapon they have. They're big up front and their skilled people all have breakaway speed and their defense has played very stingy all season long. We need to control the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball and our tackling

has to get a lot better. Last year that hurt us against them. If we go out and set the tone defensively, it just seems to make everything else work better. I think we're going to have to throw the ball some to be successful against them. They blitz a lot and will give you a lot of different looks defensively and they will crowd the line of scrimmage, so we're going to have to be able to move the ball through the air to keep them honest."

Joining Thomas in the Bobcat backfield will be quarterback Don Grunden and fullback Kyle Timmons who will share the rushing load. When the Bobcats go to the air, look for wingback Michael Brisco, tight end Kevin Keys and split end Jeffery Evans to be on the receiving end of Grunden's passes. The Childress offensive line averages 226-lbs. per man.

Defensively, the Bobcats are led by defensive end Caleb Seal, middle linebacker Simon Arcivar and their safeties Keys and Jaycin Smothermon. Their defensive line averages 225-lbs. per man.

Pre-game prayer solution reached

Iowa Parkans may see more radios in the stands than ever before, thanks to an inventive solution to the recent pre-game prayer issue.

The radio station that broadcasts Hawk football games each week, Y-104 FM, has agreed to sell airtime to an anonymous group for a pre-recorded prayer to be run during the moment of silence before the games.

The anonymous group, "Friends of the Iowa Park Schools," will pay \$10 for each spot.

Iowa Park High School student Karen Schell will pre-record the prayer, off school property. Anyone with a radio will be able to hear the

prayer. Several weeks ago, the Iowa Park schools were put on notice by the American Civil Liberties Union that student-led prayers broadcast on school-owned public announcement systems are prohibited.

Since then, many parents and church leaders have tried to come to an amicable solution to the problem without breaking the law.

The idea of broadcasting a student-led prayer over the radio came from a West Texas school. Radio airways are free and not controlled by the school district, therefore posing no problem for the district.

Electra wants water

The mayor of Electra is to appear before the Iowa Park city council Monday night, to request permission to purchase raw water from Buffalo Lake.

The meeting's tentative agenda indicates LaJone Lewis will make a personal appearance in her effort to secure an additional source of drinking water for her city.

An alternative suggestion, according to the agenda, would be to request treated water from the water tower on the north side of US 287.

According to news reports, the lake from which Electra normally

takes its water supply is extremely low, and alternative sources are being sought.

The meeting is to get underway at 7 p.m., in council chambers.

Also to be considered during the meeting is authority for the city administrator to advertise for bids on two vehicles, a cruiser for the police department and a pickup for code enforcement.

In addition, Administrator Mike Price will ask for council approval to close portions of Wall and Cash on Saturday, Oct. 16, for the annual Whoop-T-Do activities.

The youth was transported to the police station, where he was issued a citation for Class C assault, and later returned to his residence in the 1090 block of Foley, according to the police blotter.

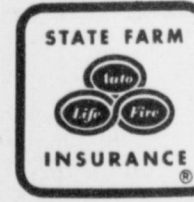

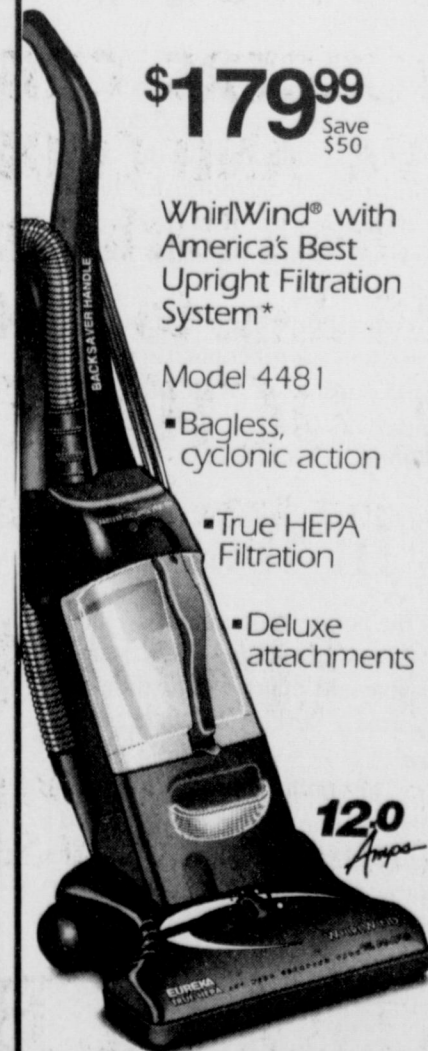

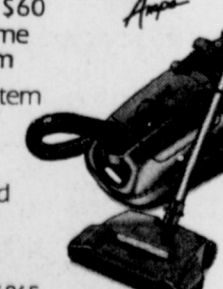

The Valley View 4-H Club is an organization of young members and adult leaders who take the 4-H organization very seriously. Naturally, the club is celebrating National 4-H week with numerous activities that will culminate with a Wichita County 4-H Achievement Banquet Saturday at the Iowa Park RAC.

Valley View members met Wednesday and have been delivering baked good to "Friends of 4-H," putting up posters in local businesses and preparing for the banquet.

Valley View 4-H will soon begin preparing for their annual rib and sausage supper, prepared by Pete Ernis. The community event and fund-raiser for the club will be held Nov. 6 at the Kamay Volunteer Fire Dept.

The Valley View 4-H Club began as a school club at Valley View High School in the 1940's. The Valley View Riding Club was formed in the early 1960's with some of the leaders being Orlin Dickerson, C.E. and Pauline Myers and J.B. and Edith Downs.

In 1978 the Valley View 4-H Club was formed by Doris McKenzie and Judy Webb, and presented a charter. Other club managers throughout the years have been Donna Hodges, Pat Cravens, Francis Howell, DeAuta Vernon, and Wayne and Brenda Edwards.

In 1995, Donna Myers assumed the position of club manager, which she still holds. She was joined in 1996 by Pam Tyler as co-manager.

Valley View 4-H is a family oriented organization, with a great deal of support from families of the members, according to Mrs. Myers. The club stresses family involvement in everything that the members do. Mrs. Myers said that being in a rural area and small community, the residents of Valley View, Kamay and Iowa Park are very supportive of the club youth.

The club has grown over the years with membership reaching 60 this year, and still growing. Many of the members have animal projects, but several are also involved in food and nutrition, clothing and fashion, home design, photography, trapshoot, as well as others.

Community service is another hallmark of the club, with them participating in several projects each year.

Members have provided address signs to residents in an effort to aid emergency personnel with locating homes easier. They also conduct food drives, have adopted a section of highway in Valley View for trash pickup, helped out families in need, collected money for the Muscular Dystrophy Assoc., conducted a cemetery improvement project and will help with Meals on Wheels this year.

I haven't decided whether it was

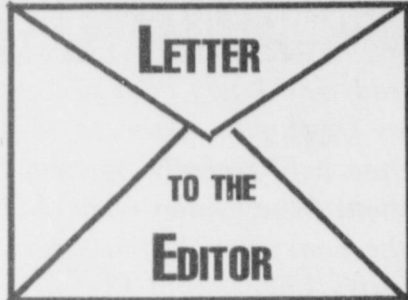
a cost-cutting project for the company, or it was the successful urging of Kay Yeager, the Wichita Falls mayor who feels the county, and all within its border, belongs to her city.

The people of Andrews county were robbed of a great chance of economic prosperity as the legislature adjourned in Austin.

This time, at least a vote was taken in both the Senate and the House. An overwhelming majority, were all for giving Andrews County a much needed chance at diversification.

But three things stood in the way of Andrews. Politics, competitors, and environmentalists.

We just recently came to understand the latter.

When you have a problem, low-level nuclear waste, and you have a solution, WCS and their proven waste site, it would seem logical that we could move forward.

In fact, you're taking waste that's being stored in uncontrolled and unmonitored storage buildings, basements, and fields across the state

and move it all to a regulated, controlled, and monitored site.

But the problem is that the environmentalists don't want a solution. The problem of disposal is their main squeeze on nuclear energy.

The main reason the United States is far behind Germany, France, and other countries in the use of clean, safe, and cheap nuclear energy for power production is because the environmentalists have stifled new plants around the country. And lack of disposal is a key argument.

In Texas, over a decade of delays at Comanche Peak because of environmentalists now cost taxpayers.

And now, with added delays on the disposal of radioactive dirt, taxpayers are again paying the tab.

Natural resource committee chairman, Rep. Warren Chisum was obviously against anything that would

benefit WCS and Andrews. His close ties to Environcare lobbyist Billy Clayton would be more than enough cause.

If the politics going on in Austin weren't enough, Environcare hit a goldmine in their hiring of Rick Jacobi, with his title of former Director of the Low Level Authority.

His constant attempts at gaining headlines with comments that didn't even appear to help his own company, must have also had an effect on the final outcome.

We don't personally understand the credibility of the man probably responsible for the 18 year, \$53 million fiasco of looking for a site. Perhaps with him gone, the state can accomplish something.

Perhaps the people that live in metropolitan areas around dangerous storage locations will send the few in Austin that extended the delima a letter.

Fortunately we can write our elected officials, Rep. Gary Walker and Sen. Teel Bivens and thank them for working so hard to give Andrews a chance to solve the low-level waste problem.

Apple-A-Day Recipes

Tasty Apple Salad

- 1 (20 ounce) can pineapple tidbits, drain and save juice
- 2 cups miniature marshmallows
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1 Tbls. flour
- 1 egg, beaten
- 1 1/2 Tbls. vinegar
- 1 (8 ounces) container Cool Whip
- 2 cups chopped apples with skins (Red Delicious)
- 1 1/2 cups dry roasted peanuts, chopped

Mix pineapple juice, sugar, flour, egg, and vinegar in pan. Cook until thick. Refrigerate overnight. Next day, or 8 hours, mix together apples, nuts, Cool Whip, pineapple, marshmallows, and pineapple juice; mix and refrigerate until ready to serve.

Apple Schmarren

- 1/4 cup flour
- 2 tsp. sugar
- 3/8 tsp. salt
- 2/3 cup milk
- 2 eggs
- 1 medium tart apple, peeled and thinly sliced
- 1 1/2 tsp. raisins, optional
- Cinnamon and powdered sugar
- 3 Tbl. butter

Combine first three ingredients. Whisk in milk and eggs. Peel apple; slice into batter. Add raisins; fry batter in the butter. Use at least an eight inch non-stick skillet.

It should be nicely browned on all sides, so don't stir too often.

Serve with cinnamon and powdered sugar sprinkled over the top.

Apple Spinach Slaw

- 5 ounces (about 5 cups) fresh spinach

- leaves, cut into thin strips.
- 1 Yellow Delicious apple, cored and chopped
 - 1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
 - 1/2 pint (1 cup) raspberries
 - 2 green onions, chopped
 - 1/4 tsp. black pepper
 - 1/4 cup fat-free or low-fat poppyseed salad dressing

Toss spinach, apple, cheese, raspberries, onions, and pepper together in large bowl.

Add dressing. Toss to combine immediately before serving.

Easy Apple Tarts

- 4 cups peeled, sliced cooking apples
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 3 Tbls. flour
- 1 tsp. cinnamon
- 1 tsp. nutmeg
- 1 (8-ounce) can quick crescent dinner rolls

Topping:
1/2 cup brown sugar
1 tsp. cinnamon
2 Tbls. margarine, melted

Combine first five ingredients. Separate dough into four triangles. Press two of these over bottom of pan. Spread apple mixture over dough and then place two remaining rectangles on top.

Combine brown sugar and cinnamon; sprinkle over top. Drizzle with margarine.

Bake at 375 degrees for 30-40 minutes.

Apple Roly Poly

- 2 cups prepared baking mix
- 1/2 cup honey
- 3/4 tsp. cinnamon
- 1/4 tsp. nutmeg
- 1/4 tsp. cloves
- 3 Tbls. sugar
- 5 large tart apples, peeled, cored, finely chopped
- 2 Tbls. butter or margarine

Prepare baking mix as directed on package. On lightly floured board, roll dough into 1/4 inch oblong (about 10 X 12).

Spread with honey to within 1 inch of the edges of dough.

Combine spices and sugar. Toss with apples. Spread apples evenly over the honey, and dot apples with butter.

Roll up like jelly roll and seal well.

Bake in greased pan with sides at 350 degrees for 40 minutes.

Slice and serve hot with whipped cream, hot lemon, or vanilla sauce.

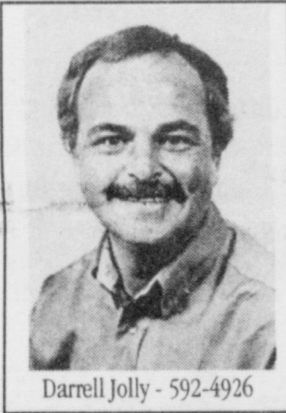

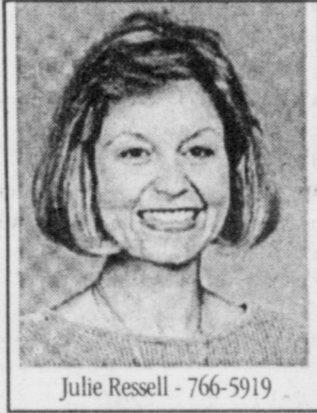
