The Golden Cranes' claim fame has to be their defense. Crane has posted six shutouts For the year and has allowed a total of only 50 points in its 12 games so far. That's an average of just over four points per contest. The six teams the Cranes have shut out include district opponents Ft. Stockton, McCamey, Monahans, Alpine, Presidio, and a Bi-District win over Slayton.

Their defense is led by their line onsisting of Luis Hernandez, a 10 lo. noseguara, Tyler Nelson, a 210 Hemandez, a 172 - lb . defensive tackle Clay McGuire and Juan Hernandez play the defensive end positions, with Hemandez weighing in at 170 and McGuire, who also starts at quarterback weighing in at 210 .
