Hawks seeking revenge In re-match with Crane Saturday night

In the NCAA Basketball Tournament they call it the Sweet 16. In High School football, they

call it Regionals.

The Iowa Park Hawks reached the Regional Round of the Class 3A State Playoffs with a come from behind win over China Spring last week, and will now turn their attention to the team that ended their season last

The Crane Golden Cranes, 12-0 overall and ranked number four in the final regular season AP Poll, eliminated Iowa Park from the playoffs last year beating the Hawks 16-7.

This year the two teams will meet Saturday night at 7:30 in Sweetwater at the Mustang Bowl to determine who will advance to the Quarterfinals.

Going to the game Pep Rally Friday

The entire community of Iowa Park is encouraged to attend a pep rally for Saturday's big football game. It will be held Friday night in Hawk Stadium, weather permitting, starting at 8:00. If weather does not permit, it will be moved into the gymnasium.

No Advance Ticket Sales

Because of the Thanksgiving holidays, there will be no pre-game ticket sales. All tickets will be sold at the stadium gates; \$4 for students and \$6 for adults.

Mustang Bowl is located north of 12th Street, between Elm and Hailey (traffic lights are at both intersections).

When entering Sweetwater on I-20 from the East (from Abilene), take Exit 247 to East Broadway, and turn north (right) onto Hailey.

Those entering Sweetwater from the North on Hwy. 70, from Roby, should continue on Hwy. 70 to 12th Street,

Crane defeated Friona 43-16 Saturday to advance to the Regional Championship game.

The Golden Cranes' claim to fame has to be their defense.

Crane has posted six shutouts for the year and has allowed a total of only 50 points in its 12 games so far. That's an average of just over four points per contest. The six teams the Cranes have shut out include district opponents Ft. Stockton, McCamey, Monahans, Alpine, Presidio, and a Bi-District win over Slayton.


Their defense is led by their line consisting of Luis Hernandez, a 170lb. noseguard, Tyler Nelson, a 210lb. defensive tackle, along with Ceasar Hernandez, a 172-lb. defensive tackle. Clay McGuire and Juan Hernandez play the defensive end positions, with Hernandez weighing in at 170 and McGuire, who also starts at quarterback weighing in at 210. McGuire twisted his ankle in the win over Friona and had to leave the game, but is expected back this week.

Linebackers for the Cranes include Michael Cavazos and Harold Jeffery, with Cavazos weighing 175 and Jeffery 185. The secondary is also not very big, with the four defensive backs weighing an average of 161 pounds, led by strong safety Philip Tarin, a 5-8 130-lb. senior.

"Defensively they're very strong," said head coach Weldon Nelms. "It looks like you've got a big hole to run through where you would normally get eight or nine yards, but against them it's only two or three yards. They close on the ball exceptionally fast. They are very strong

Hawks rally to edge Cougars, 29-25


In the first round of the State Playoffs against Ballinger, Iowa Park blew away the Bearcats 68-17, scoring 10 touchdowns along the way.

and play low to the ground because of their lack of size. In the secondary they mix it up and play a lot of man and zone coverages. I think the opportunity is there to make some big plays in our passing game.

"The key for our offense is first down I think,"Nelms said. "If we can be successful on first down and stay out of second and third and long we'll be okay. If we don't it goes in their favor. We have to be able to move the ball through the air. We can't go in there and expect to just run the ball."

The Crane offense isn't doing too shabby either, averaging 39.6 points per contest.

The Golden Cranes are led offensively by McGuire, a 210-lb. senior quarterabck. McGuire has carried the ball 121 times for 715 yards and 14 touchdowns.

Joining McGuire in the backfired are fullback Lino Garcia and tailback Harold Jeffery. Garcia has accounted for 227 yards rushing and three touchdowns, while Jeffery is the team's leading rusher with 887 yards on 126 carries and has scored 14 times.

The offensive line averages 205 pounds per man and is led by Tyler

Nelson and Dustin Johns. When the Cranes go to the air, look for Joe Henderson and Philip Tarin to be on the receiving end.

The Golden Cranes are averaging 379 total yards per game, with 256 coming on the ground and 123 through the air. Crane is averaging 13.6 first downs per game as well.

McGuire has completed 69 of his 130 attempts for a 53% completion ratio and has thrown for a total of 1,312 yards and 13 touchdowns for an average of 19 yards per completion.

"Offensively they will give you alot of different looks," Nelms stated. "Their quarterback is the key to their offense. As he goes so goes his team. He's a big strong kid that is a true competitor. He's one of those guys that if you need four yards he gets five. If you need 15 he gets 16. They run a lot of sweeps, counters and will run the fullback up the middle and try to hit a crease. They throw the ball well and have a very good play action pass that really can hurt you. That was a big play for them last year againstus. Their quarterback was hurt in their last game, but we expect him to be back this week. He was really hobbeling following the game. Maybe it will slow him down a step or two, especially on his cuts.

"We need to have a solid kicking game as well," Nelms added. "Last week we had a big play from our kickoff return team and that really shifted the momentum of the game. We have to play solid and not have any breakdowns. Games like this are usually won by the team that makes the fewest mistakes."

Iowa Park comes into the game averaging 43.3 points per game and 421.3 yards per game. So it comes down to a good offense against a

good defense.

The Hawks got back at China Spring for the loss the Cougars handed the Hawks in the 1998 baseball playoffs. Now Iowa Park will have the opportunity to settle the score with the Cranes.

And should the Hawks defeat Crane and Childress beat Midland, Iowa Park would get another shot at the Bobcats, the team that prevented the Hawks from winning the District Championship.

Like their motto has been all year long, "Unfinished Business", the Hawks will get a chance to finish what they started last year, Saturday night in Sweetwater.

The Midget Central Hawks came from behind to defeat the Quanah Indians Saturday to claim the Top Of Texas Championship 14-12.


Iowa Park trailed 12-0 at the half before starting their comeback bid.
