Firemen Need Help to Buy Miracle Life Saving Machine



Iowa Park Volunteer Firemen are trying to add another piece of equipment to the department to help them protect the lives of the folk in this area.

No larger than a suitcase, the resuscitator actually has brought people back to life after they have been declared dead. It is a miracle worker when accidents causing failure occur — accidents such as drowning, electric shock, smoke suffocation, gas poisoning or just plain shock from an automobile accident.

And the resuscitator works just as well if a patient is struggling to breathe after a heart attack or a bad spell of asthma.

Use of the machine is so simple a child could save a life with this portable machine. All it needs to function is oxygen, and that is available at filling stations and welding shops. The two tanks are kept full for emergency use at all times.

"Help the community restore the breath of life to someone" is the slogan of the Firemen as they begin a drive to buy this machine. It can be seen at the Lone Star Gas or Texas Electric Service offices here.

You may give your donation to any member of the Fire department, at the State National Bank or at the place where the resuscitator is on display.

A complete list will be kept, and if there isn't enough money donated to buy the machine, the money will be returned to its donors.

This equipment is ready for use and already most of the firemen know how to operate it. If anyone should need it, call as you would for a fire alarm, and the resuscitator will be rushed to the victim and put in instant use.

Area towns with this equipment include Jacksboro, Henrietta, Nacoga, Bowie, Bridgeport and Electra.
