

Whereas, the City Council of the City of Iowa Park has requested that Southwestern Bell Telephone company so extend said local calling area of the Iowa Park exchange and the telephone company has so agreed,

Now, therefore be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Iowa Park:

Section 1: That Southwestern Bell Telephone company shall continue in effect the following schedule of rates for local exchange telephone service:
