## H. M. Nipper Coming to Bank

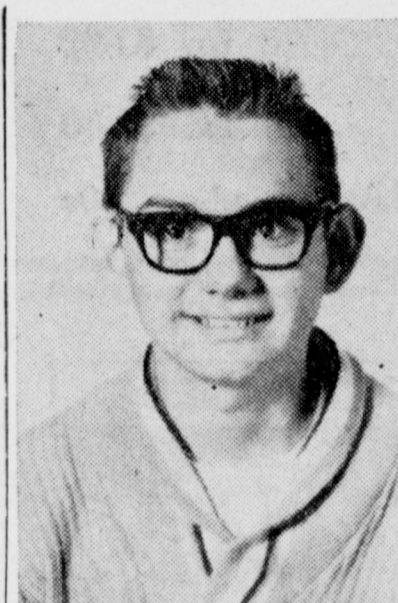

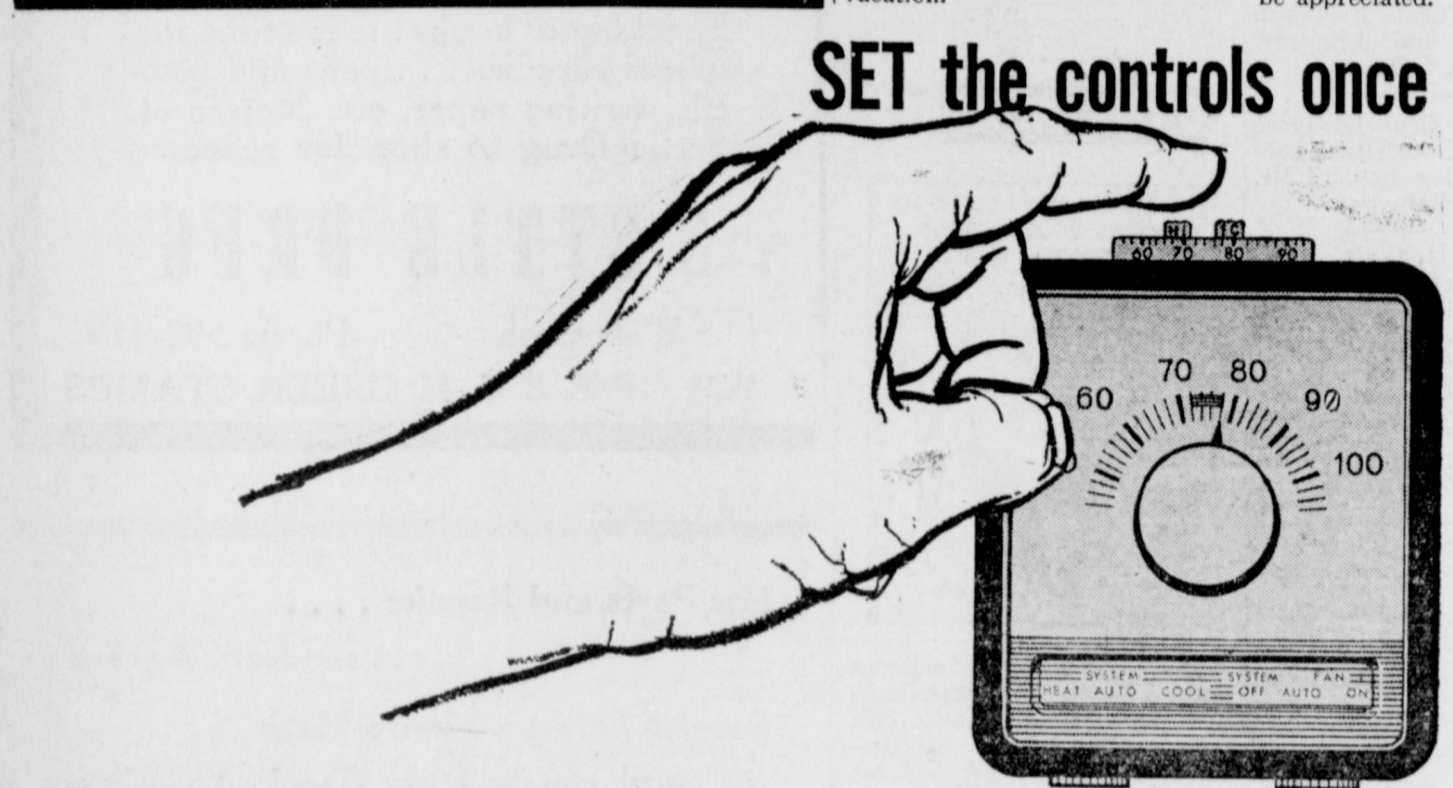

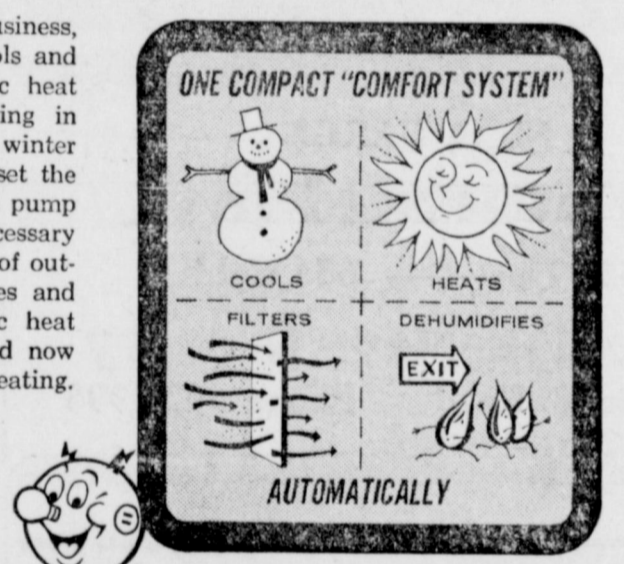
