It was my pleasure to address the graduating classes of Crowell county health unit, who is vitally interested in the Mental Health ligh school and of Rider high of Wichita Falls Wichita Falls.

I have great confidence in the youth of our nation. We hear of much trouble involving youngsters. We hear entirely too little about their worthwhile accomplishments. I think its is important to remember that only about 2 per cen of our juveniles ever run afoul of the law for any kind of offense. The other 98 per cent are by and large quite worthwhile

During a recent trip I made to the South Pole, I was astounded by the complexity of our scientific endeavors there. A group of scientists, supported and supplied by a group of navy personnel, spends 7 months during the total darkness of Antarctic winter studying atmospheric there. These experts say if we can learn more of weather patterns and conditions at the bottom of he world, we can save unold millions of dollars by being able to predict the weather more accurately.

At one of the stations this scientific research is headed by a scientist who is just 24 years old. The navy support group is headed by another man just 24 years of age. These young men exemplify the capabilities and accomplishments of our youth.

I tried to impress on the graduates of the two schools where I appeared the opportunities which are before them, and of the dedi-

#### cation of purpose they must have to accomplish their goal. History is full of stories about people from most humble beginnings who have risen to the highest pinnacles of success. All it really takes to gain

these heights is dedication, desire and lots of hard work. I tried also to impress upon the graduates their responsibilities

for good citizenship. With every rght and freedom goes a responsibility. To remain free and strong we must accept these responsibilities and do our share of work for our community, state and nation.




