For easier seeing at the study table, a good table lamp with at least a 150 watt bulb or equivalent is recommended. The lamp should be tall enough to spread light evenly over the work surface and properly shaded to conceal the light source from the eyes. A diffusing bowl (or a bulb with its own built-in diffuser) is recommended to soften the light and prevent glare. Check your children's study light now. Make sure they have proper light for easy seeing when they do
