



lowing two years of illness. Resident of Iowa Park since 1907, Burrows was born near Bebee, Ark., Feb. 25, 1885. He was married to Miss Annie Bassinger in Nash, Texas, in 1904.

When they first moved to Iowa Park he was engaged in farming. Later he became substitute carrier on Route One. He was the first appointed rural carrier of Route Three and made the 20-mile trip on a bicycle at first. Later he used a horse cart, motorcycle with sidecar, a motor buggy, and finally a car. During this time, Burrows

also operated a blacksmith shop. In 1952 he was appointed Iowa Park postmaster by Herbert Hoover, a position he held more than eight years.

Mr. Burrows was a member of First Methodist church, Masonic Lodge No. 713 and the Shriners.




