Wherefore, premises considered Plaintiff prays that the Defendant be cited to appear and answer herein; that upon a final hearing of this cause Plaintiff have judgment for divorce against the Defendant; that the court divest title to the real estate above described out of the Defendant and vest title to the same; that Plaintiff have such other, further and general relief, in law and in equity, to which she may be justly entitled.

If this citation is not served within ninety days after the date of issuance, it shall be returned unserved.

**Christmas Mailing Suggestions**

"Please pack parcels solidly," says Postmaster T. E. Gilbreath to local patrons as they begin preparing their Christmas mail. He also reminds patrons that the use of free "Local" and "Out of Town" separation bands will help move the mail faster. The bands are available at the post office or from most letter carriers.

Dec. 5 is the suggested deadline for mailing out-of-town gifts. "Don't worry about their being delivered too early, just mark them not to be opened 'til Christmas," Gilbreath says.

A tightly stuffed package with nothing rattling around inside will have less chance of being damaged in transit. When packing a gift, remember your package may be shipped on the bottom of a mail sack and there may be heavy packages on top. Among the few packages damaged in transit, improper packaging is the greatest factor.

Gilbreath suggests that all gift packages be insured. Illegible addresses are responsible for the non-delivery of many parcels each year. If the return address is illegible, the package will be saved for 90 days and then sold at public auction.

Parcels should be addressed on only one side and should also have the address written on the inside of the package in case the wrapping should come off.
