## Hunter Warns of Dangers

Coney O. Walker, whose work as hunter of predatory animals in this area is authorized by the U.S. Fish and Wild Life Service, manages to keep rather busy. He says his work is not to eradicate completely all predatory animals. Rather, he controls the wild life population to meet the needs of the area.

In connection with his work are two dangers he asked us to point out to hunters and other outdoorsmen. Whenever he has poison pellets in a field, he always posts notice of their presence at every gate leading to the field. And within 5 feet of each cyanide gun he sets a sign proclaiming its presence and warning people to stay away.

Walker, who came here in April 1961, resides at 410 West Ruby. His phone number is 592-2027, and he asks land owners or farmers to contact him whenever they are troubled by predatory animals.
