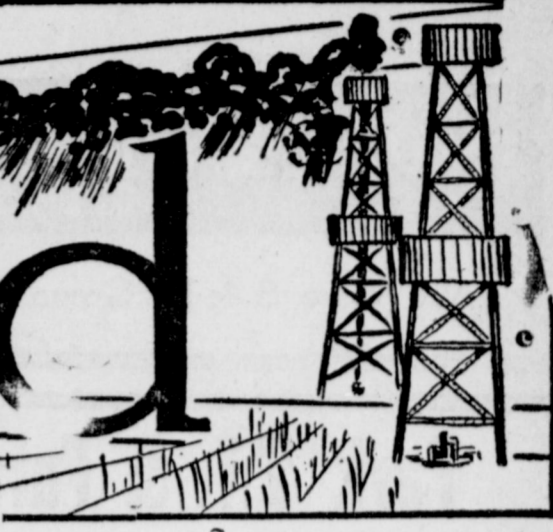

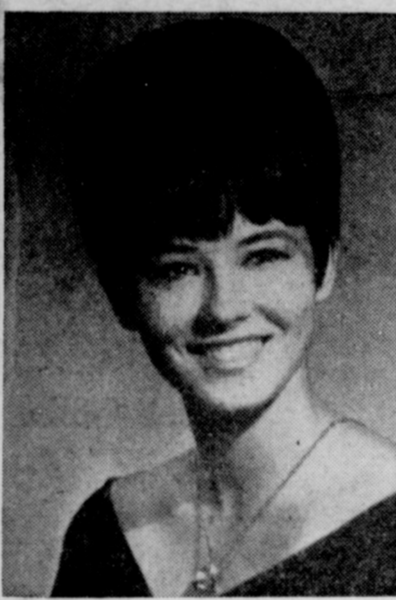

**Old I. P. Grads Rally**

Students and graduates of Iowa Park school before 1914 were honor guests of the classes of 1914 and 1915 at a reunion held in fellowship hall of First Baptist church Tuesday evening.

First school here was a frame building in the south part on what is now South Yosemite between Ruby and Lafayette streets. In 1901, a two-story brick was erected on East Cash, site of the present W. F. George building.

First graduating class was in 1908 with four members, all of whom are living: Noel Troutman of Bloydada, Beulah Brubaker Ellison of Arlington, Emma Winfrey Mathis of Wichita Falls and Rose McCleskey Friberg of Dallas. These graduates received diplomas for completion of tenth grade.

The next year the 11th grade was added, so there was no graduating class in 1909.

Before 1908 when students went as far as they could in the local school they did not receive a diploma, but they were ready to go to the college of their choice. Mrs. Will Burnett of Iowa Park completed her work in 1903 and went on to CIA in Denton to complete her college education.

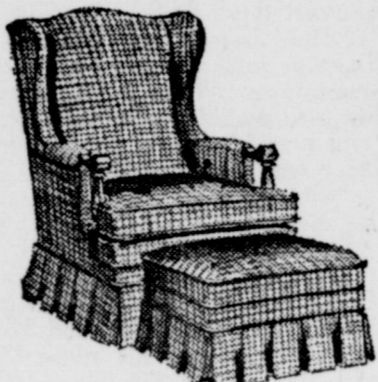

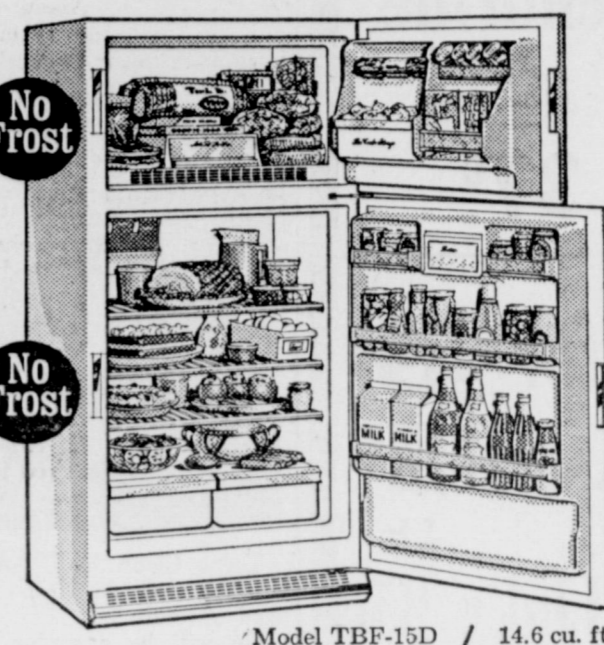
Schild has been doing research at Yale university and he hopes to be able to return to Germany and give a true account of Americans in various parts of the land and of various cultures here.
