### Students Help Decorate Doors

 Beautifully decorated classrooms in Iowa Park elementary, junior high and senior high schools attest to the interest, ingenuity and industry of room sponsors, teachers and students.  
 Tuesday afternoon while on the weekly visit to the schools, we saw a number of high school students working enthusiastically on their door yuletide decorations. It was indeed gratifying to observe their interest in the beautiful, the esthetic and the sacred.  
 Boys were working as hard as the girls. Paris Nowell, principal, and Mrs. John Klappenbach, his secretary, were co-operating to the fullest. It was quite evident that the students were aware of their interest and had no hesitancy in taking their problems to them. According to my touchstone the teacher-pupil relationship in our school system is quite satisfactory.  
 Doors in the elementary and junior high schools are tastefully decorated. Choosing the following doors to mention does not indicate that one deserves more favorable comment than the others but space does not permit describing each door.  
 Miss Helen Reed's 4th grade door is sort of a magnet pulling one's eyes and attention in that direction. Covered with sky blue and dotted with twinkling stars, it features a lad in a red felt suit riding on a large silver star. Another silver star, named Santa Land, 8 miles behind the lad, occupies a prominent place in the decorations.  
 A brief glance at some of the high school doors:  
 Room 15, Mrs. Merry McIlroy, teacher. Covered in gold, it is appointed with large plastic Santa driving his reindeer hitched to a gift-filled sleigh.  
 Mrs. Keith Swim's typing room

has a door decorated in pink and red. It is completely covered with pink and outlined with tiny pink and red lights. Center of interest is the large pink tree accented with red and pink satin streamers running horizontally the length of the tree.  
 For uniqueness, Bob Hayworth's room door rates high. It is covered with with gold and framed with tiny Christmas lights. Centered is an eye-catching tree which features alternate layers of miniature Santa's clad in red felt and gold balls.  
 Coach Tommy Watkins' door is silver-covered and centered with a lovely pink wreath sprayed with white snow. Above the wreath the word Seniors is spelled out in royal blue and below Merry Christmas appears in the same color.  
 When this reporter visited high school Wednesday morning, she saw Susie Farmer and Sharon Fortner working diligently to complete door decorations for Mrs. China B. Smith's room.

Jefferson City, Mo.  
Dec. 15, 1963

Dear George and Ona Lou, George and Bobbie, Tom and Vernodene, Ben and Lou Ann, and the Grandchildren:
