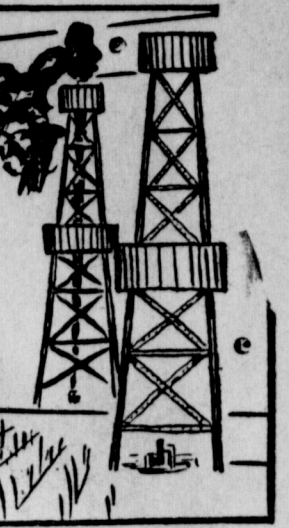

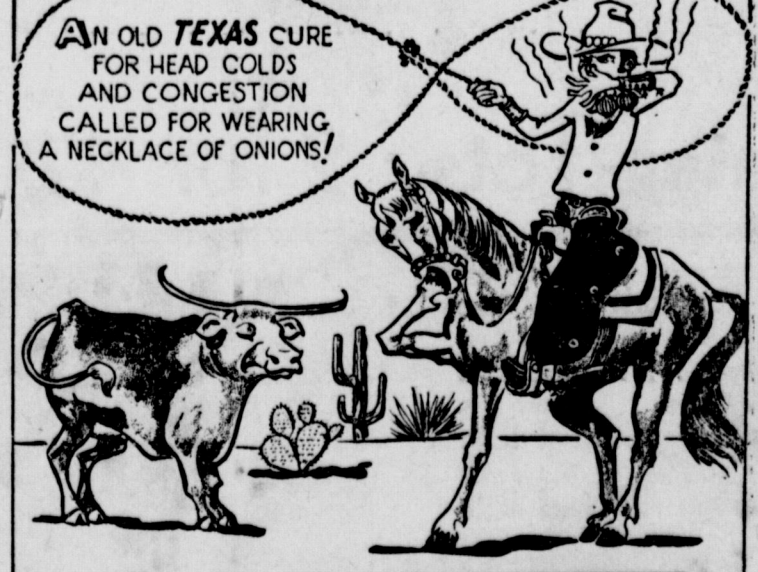
Paris, a veteran of World War II, died Monday in Clay County Memorial hospital.

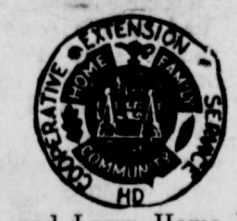
Mrs. Diana Moran teaches junior and senior high girls physical education. She is also pep

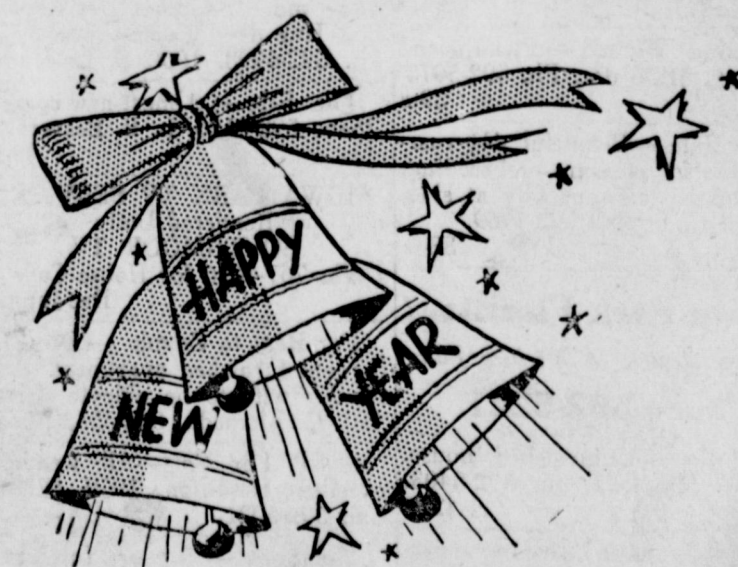

Claude Walker of Electra was best man. A reception was held in Fellowship hall of the church. The table was covered with lace over blue and centered with a blue and white arrangement.

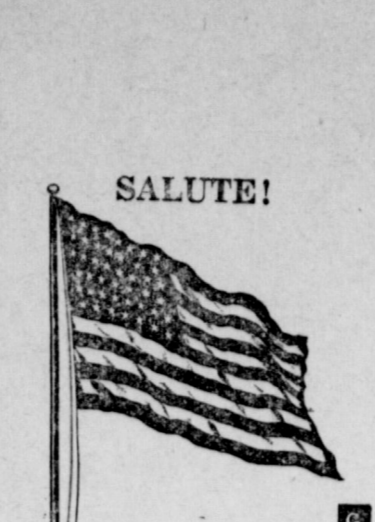

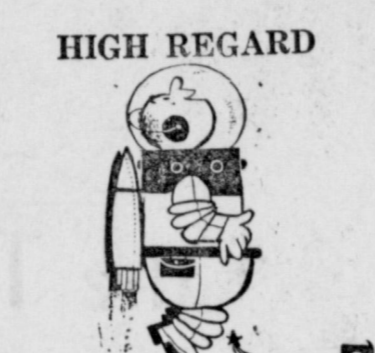
