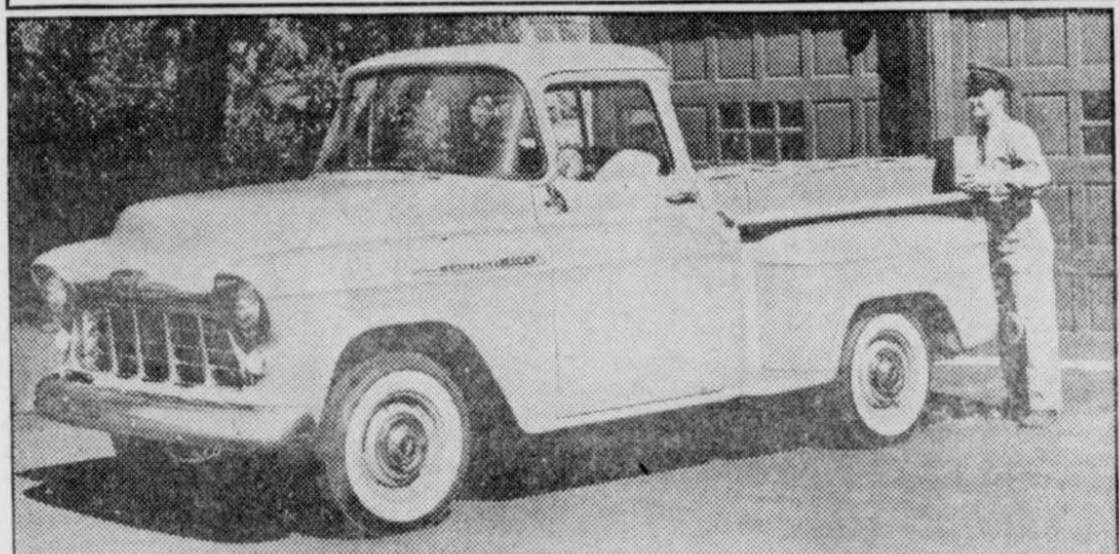

### TEXAS TRUCKER OF THE YEAR IS M. W. DENNEY

Dallas, selected as "Most Representative Hobbs Knight of the Road for 1955" for his heroic action in rescuing a six-year-old boy from a dog that mauled him badly last Aug. 18, Denney, a Dallas city driver for Merchants Fast Motor Lines, will be honored at a Feb. 7 award banquet in Austin, at which Colonel Homer Garrison, director of the Texas Department of Public Safety, will be the principal speaker. Denney was chosen from 99 truck drivers cited as Hobbs Knights of the Road for their highway courtesy last year and will receive the "1955 Shield." This will be the second annual celebration for the awards program which is sponsored by Hobbs Trailers, a division of the Fruehauf Trailer Company; the Texas Safety Association; and the public safety department's license and weight division. ## Cigaret vs Cancer ESA Items...

Nearly every adult in Iowa Park is concerned, directly or indirectly, with a bit of unusual detective work that has just been completed.

The half-million dollar investigation concerns lung cancer. Results of this research appear in the current issue of Atlantic Monthly. A medical and scientific director of American Cancer Society, Dr. Charles S. Cameron, has written the article entitled "Lung Cancer and Smoking—What We Really Know."

"This account of the association between cigarette smoking and the growth of lung cancer is a report of known facts and statistics," says Dr. T. M. Clark of Iowa Park, local representative of the Wichita county unit of ACS. "It may save lives," Clark stated. According to Dr. Cameron, tobacco has not been proved guilty of causing lung cancer, but tobacco has been shown to have been on the scene of the crime.

"Lung cancer death rate curve suggests that whatever agent is responsible for the present increase in cancer of the lung is of recent appearance in terms of its current prevalence, did not involve men who are now beyond the age of 70, but did involve men who are 65 to 70, and in the light of usual exposure period necessary to produce cancer, about 20 to 30 years ago. This puts the critical exposure period in the 1920's and early '30's, when the susceptibles were relatively young men."

"Death rates from cancer of the lung were at least five times higher in the heavy cigarette smoking group than in non-smokers. The ACS does not propose to tell the public not to smoke. It does intend to equip the national conscience with the information by which it can make up its own mind fairly. It time should establish the innocence of tobacco, such a course will prove less blameworthy than failure to suggest caution."

Dr. Clark says, "Everyone in Iowa Park who is old enough to smoke should be interested in reading this article for the light it sheds on the lung-cancer-tobacco problem." Films and general information on cancer are available to all groups of 10 or more interested people for the asking. They should contact the information center at 1302 Ninth in Wichita Falls, or phone 3-2263.

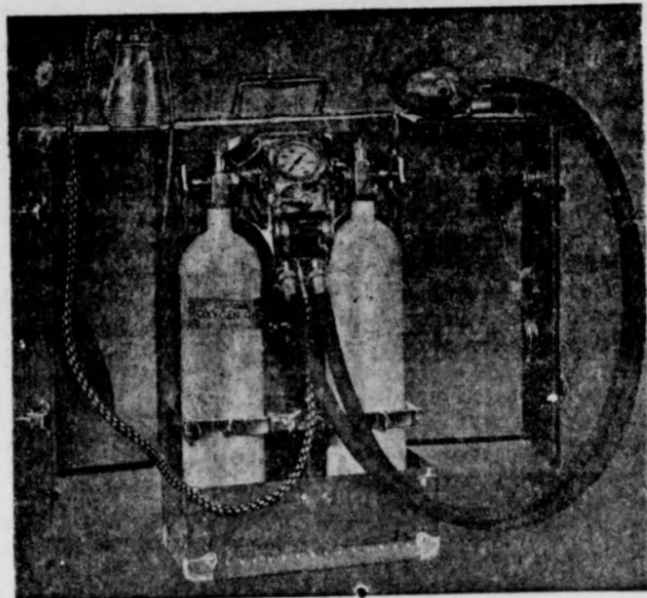

This Suspension Portable Resuscitator now belongs to the Iowa Park Fire department. Members wish to express their thanks to people of this area who have helped them secure this life saving equipment. It can breathe for one patient and aspirate another at the same time. By adding a midget resuscitator the department has, the operator can give resuscitation or inhalation to two patients and aspirate a third all at once. There is an extension hose that can be used to help a patient 25 to 50 feet from the apparatus. Oxygen is available from two different tanks.

Iowa Park was able to secure all this extra equipment only through the donations of citizens, and use of the resuscitator is available to anyone in Wichita county.

If needed at any time call the fire department, 4321, and it will be available and in use in a few minutes. The resuscitator can be used for smoke suffocation, drowning, gas poisoning, electric shock, drug poisoning, carbon monoxide, heart attack, asthma and automobile accident shock.

## HD Clubs Start Family Economics

Wichita County Home Demonstration clubs are starting Family Economics programs this month. The programs will teach women to be better business managers in their homes. There is no business more important than the business of homemaking. This month's demonstration is being given by Miss Thelma Wirges, county home demonstration agent. She encourages planning as a way to "get the things we want and need by using what we have."

Other programs for the year will be:

- Records That Help Use of Credit
- Places for Keeping Records
- Children's Allowances

For amateurs, wintertime is the safest time for transplanting, according to Miss Thelma Wirges, county home demonstration agent.

Plants that drop their leaves are dormant after leaf fall. Others are dormant usually immediately after the first two freezes. After that, plants can be moved anytime before spring growth starts.

Prepare for the job ahead of time so plants will be out of the soil for as short a time as possible. If the ground freezes, do not attempt moving plants until it is thawed. Make holes large enough so roots need not be crowded or twisted.

Good drainage is important. If water will stand in the hole for several hours, additional drainage is needed. Try breaking through the hardpan below, drain off to the

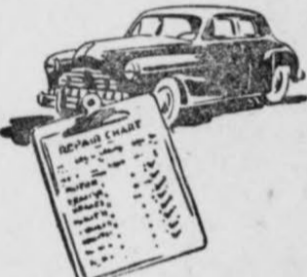

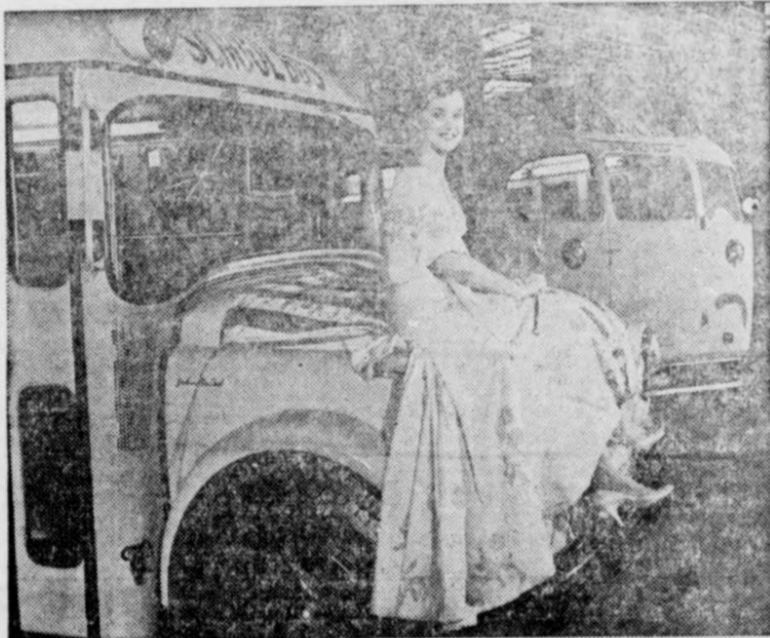

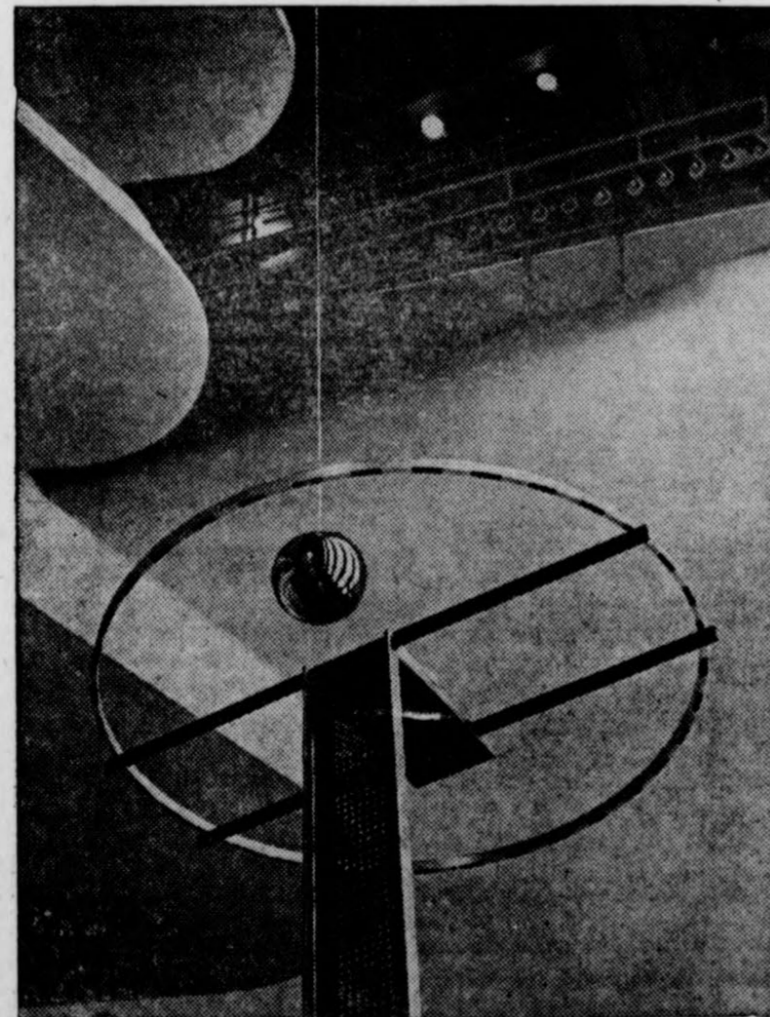

## Pendulum Gift Shows Earth's Rotation



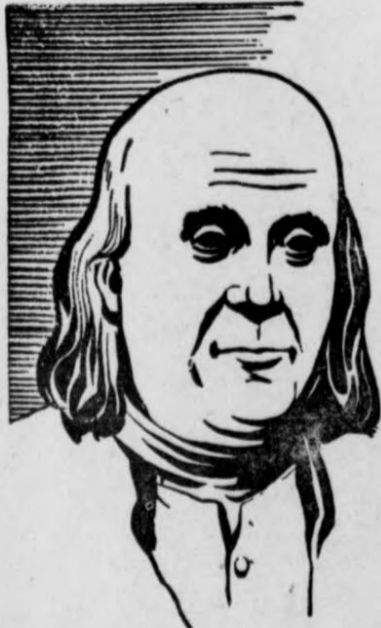
Visible proof of the earth's rotation is shown by a Foucault pendulum presented to the United Nations Headquarters recently by the Netherlands Government. It consists of 200-pound gold-plated sphere suspended by 57-foot stainless steel wire from ceiling of entrance lobby in General Assembly Hall. As earth rotates, sphere swings back and forth over a magnet, the plane of swing shifting slowly clockwise so that complete cycle is made every 36 hours and 45 minutes. Pendulum is named after French physicist Jean Bernard Foucault who used the pendulum in 1851 in Pantheon at Paris to demonstrate that the earth revolves on its axis.
