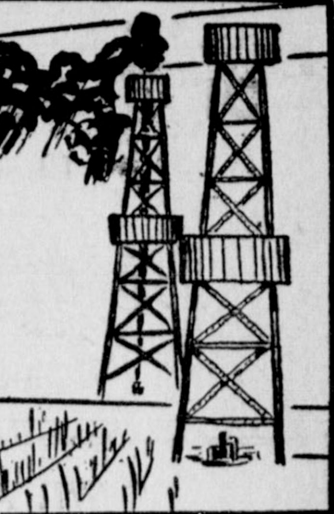

Beginnings

First National Bank of Iowa Park was organized with a capitol stock of \$25,000 by J. M. Whitmore and received its charter Tuesday, Oct. 2, 1900.

First directors and officers were C. Birk, president; W. R. Ferguson, vice-president; Whitmore, cashier; H. B. Hines; L. A. Wells.

The bank opened for business on Monday, Oct. 8, with C. Birk as first depositor. Others making deposits that first day were Henry Brockriede, J. H. Brady, W. P. Beasley, A. T. Culbertson, Emory Crites, E. J. Crites, W. P. Cagle, A. Casey, H. Casey, Dr. W. P. Doodley, H. B. Hines, S. J. Higgs, Herod Brothers, Hagy Thacker & Co.

Total deposits that first day were \$2,306.86.

At the time the charter was issued \$15,000 was paid. Ninety days later \$5,000 more was paid and in six months the final \$5,000 was paid to complete the capitol stock.

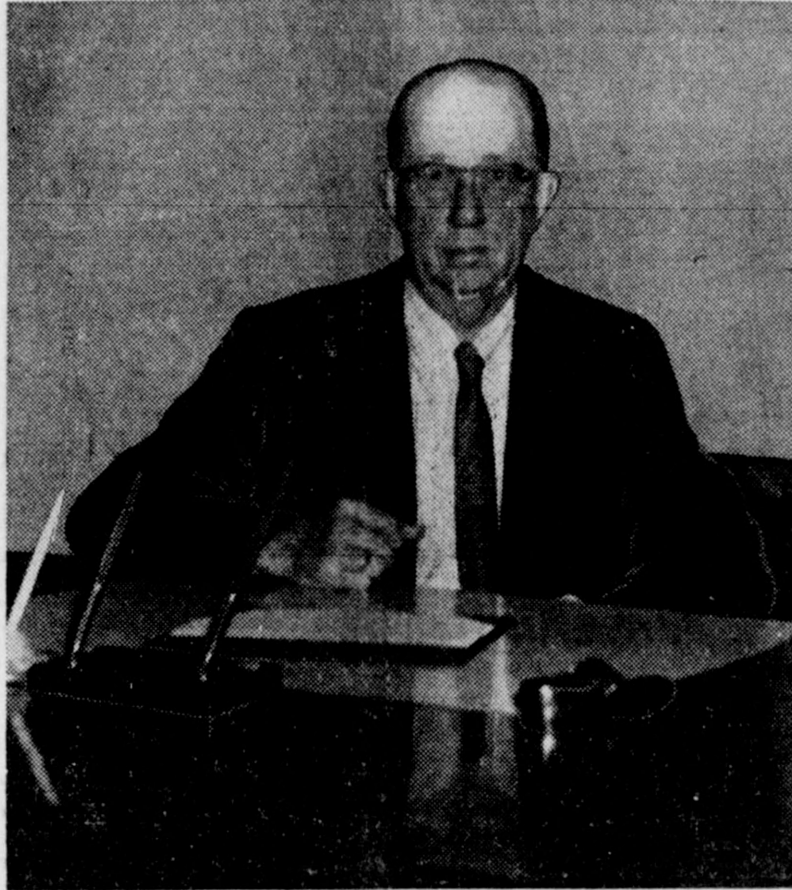
The bank has had a continuous growth since that Monday, Oct. 8, 1900, when it opened for business in a small space of a building at the corner of Wall and Park.

Mr. Birk served as president for over 25 years.

First National and its successor the State National have always been federal reserve banks.

Mr. Hill's office is paneled in walnut and features a beautiful walnut desk and matching furnishings. A tall modernistic white table lamp and beautiful oil paintings are the center of attraction in the room.

This office has a private tile rest-room.



The President

F. E. Hill, president of State National Bank, was born in Elberton, Ga., and came to Texas in 1905.

In 1919 he moved to Iowa Park where he was employed for four years with the Rexall Drug Store.

In 1923 he started as a bookkeeper for First State Bank, being later promoted to assistant cashier and then to cashier.

He was married to Miss Corrine

Stiles, July 10, 1927.

When the First State and First National banks were merged in 1932, Mr. Hill was elected vice-president, and in 1947 he was elected president.

Mr. and Mrs. Hill have a daughter Mrs. D. D. Harris jr. of Austin; a son Travis Stiles Hill of Iowa Park; and two grandchildren Trayvann, age 6, and Tommy Ford Hill, age 5.

Openhouse

State National Bank will hold an openhouse in the new \$100,000 building located on West Park, two afternoon, May 23 and 24.

Saturday from 2:30 to 5:00 the openhouse will be for neighboring bankers and for businessmen of this area.

Sunday from 2:00 to 5:00 the general public is invited to visit the new building.

New Building

1959 finds Our Town growing in stature and in favor with God and man! Population growth and business and residential building is running at top pace.

State National Bank moved recently across the street on West Park to its new home after being in the same building for the past 58½ years.

The building, which faces south, is of modern architecture, fire-proof construction and finished on the outside with modular brick. General contractor was L. A. Walker Construction Company of Midland.

The entrance with double doors of glass and aluminum, leads from the foyer into the lobby.

The vaults are double-reinforced concrete with 12-inch walls, floor and roof.

Rest-rooms are of ceramic tile. There is a utility room for storage and to house the 15-ton Carrier air-conditioning and heating unit.

The Drive-in Banking Window is at the east side of the building.

Vice-President

W. A. (Dutch) George, vice-president of State National Bank, was born on a farm northeast of Iowa Park, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. F. George.

He moved near town with his parents while a small child, and attended the Iowa Park school.

In 1937 he was graduated from the local high school, which bears his father's name. He attended New Mexico Military Institute in Roswell; the University of Texas in Austin; and Texas Tech in Lubbock.

During summer months Dutch was employed in the bookkeeping department of the bank.

In 1942 he was married to Miss Mary Frances Goins of Burk Burnett.

He served in the armed forces during World War II. On his return from service, Mr. George was elected vice-president of the bank. He has been actively engaged in that capacity since.

Dutch has been active in civic and church affairs. He is past president and past chief of the Volunteer Fire Department, a member of the Jaycees and is presently serving on the finance committee of the First Methodist church here.

Dutch and Mary Frances, who also is active in civic affairs of our community, have a son Larry and daughter Karen.

Consolidation

May 14, 1932, Iowa Park's two banks—First National and First State—were consolidated and renamed the State National Bank of Iowa Park. There were total deposits of \$258,000 and the capital and surplus were \$60,000.

Officers were: John Hirschi, president. F. E. Hill, vice-president. Herman Mills, cashier.

Directors were John Hirschi, W. F. George, John C. Murphree, L. C. Denny, L. N. Lochridge, John B. Harbour, Tom L. Burnett.

At the close of business on March 12 this year the bank had on deposit \$3,718,488.03. The capital, surplus, undivided profits and reserves added up to \$307,000 plus.



Cashier

Mrs. Mildred Traylor, cashier of State National Bank, is a member of a pioneer family, daughter of the late Mr. and Mrs. S. L. Denny.

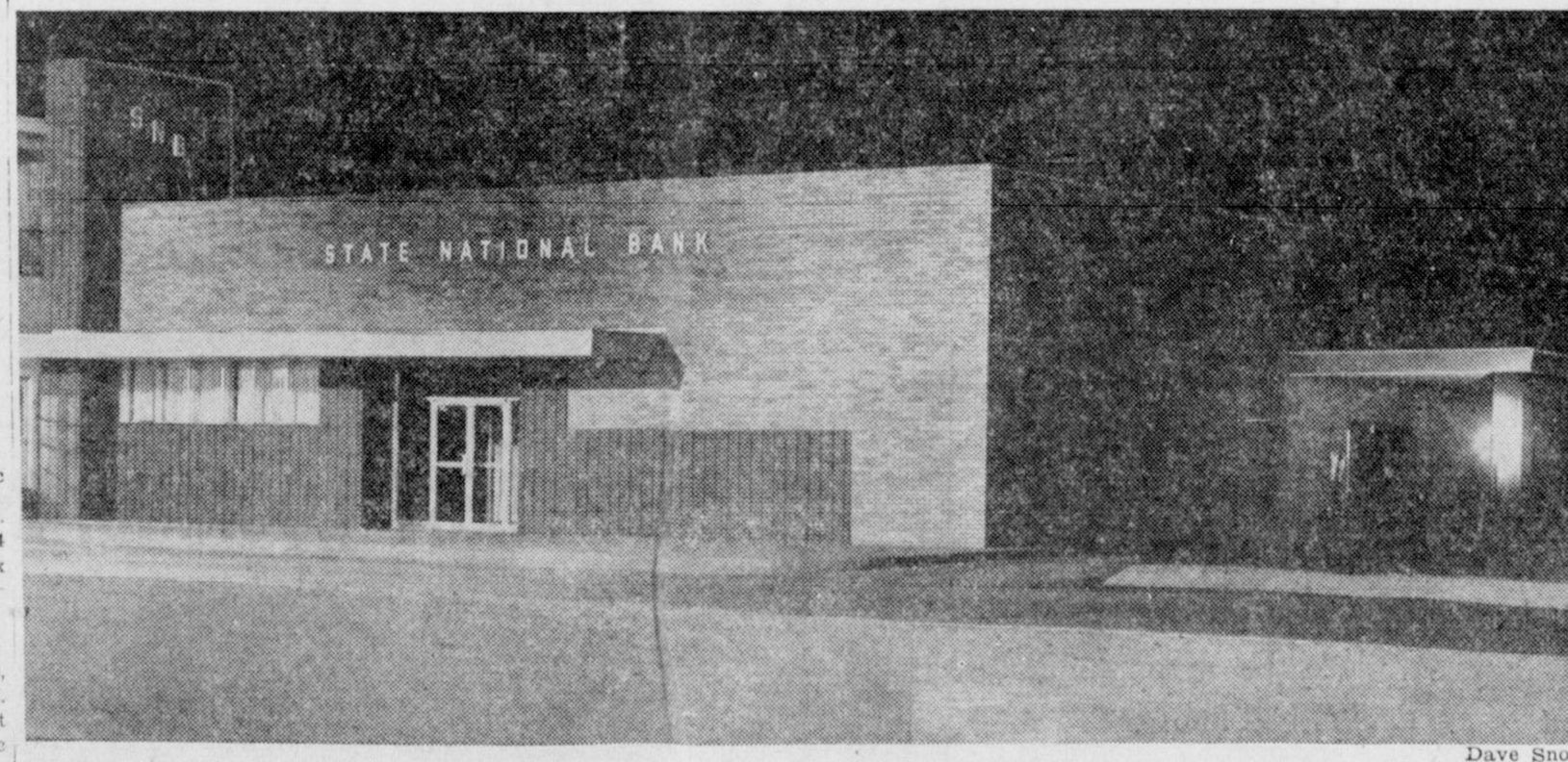
Born in the Denny community (now Valley View), she attended the Denny school and later moved to town with her parents. After graduation from IPHS, she attended the College of Industrial Arts at Denton, which is now Texas Women's university.

Mrs. Traylor started her banking career in 1925 as bookkeeper and assistant cashier of the First State Bank of Iowa Park.

She was married to Elmo Traylor in June 1930.

When the First State and First National banks merged in 1932, she was employed as bookkeeper. In the early part of the 1940's, Mildred was promoted to cashier, when Herman Mills resigned to go into defense work.

Mrs. Traylor is a member of First Methodist church; is a past matron of the Iowa Park Eastern Star chapter; a member of the local Organ club; and of Epsilon Eta chapter of Epsilon Sigma Alpha.

Accounting, Drive-in Banking, Safety Deposit Boxes

It takes nimble wits and nimble fingers to handle the mammoth task of accounting for every penny that goes through State National Bank each day. Above are some of the equipment and furnishings of the bookkeeping department, with some of the personnel.

The new type Mosler Drive-In Window located on the east side of the bank building is an added feature and courtesy to customers, who do not have to take time to come into the main building to do their banking.

This automatic, electric drive-in window is known to many as the "Come as You Are" Window.

For the convenience of the bank's patrons, a night depository is located just south of the drive-in window.

A Hadco Outdoor Aluminum Gaslight Lantern on a decorative aluminum post lights the driveway for the drive-in window and night depository.

Patrons may enter from the south off Park Avenue and exit at the alley, turning right.

Mrs. Lorene Callahan serves as

teller of the drive-in window and as personnel director of the Bookkeeping department.

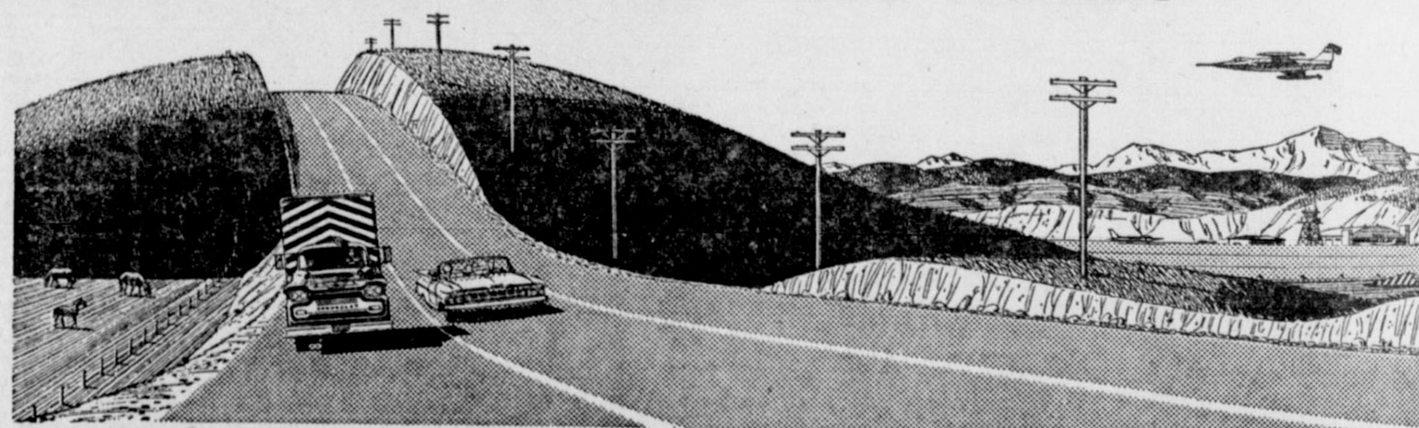

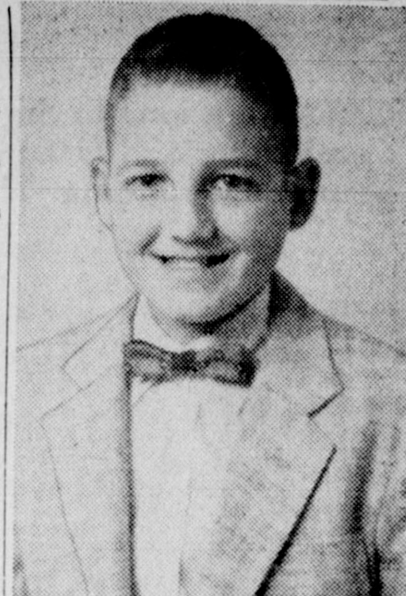

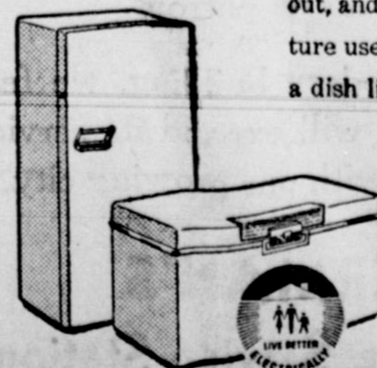
