



# Jacks & Boley Insurance Agency

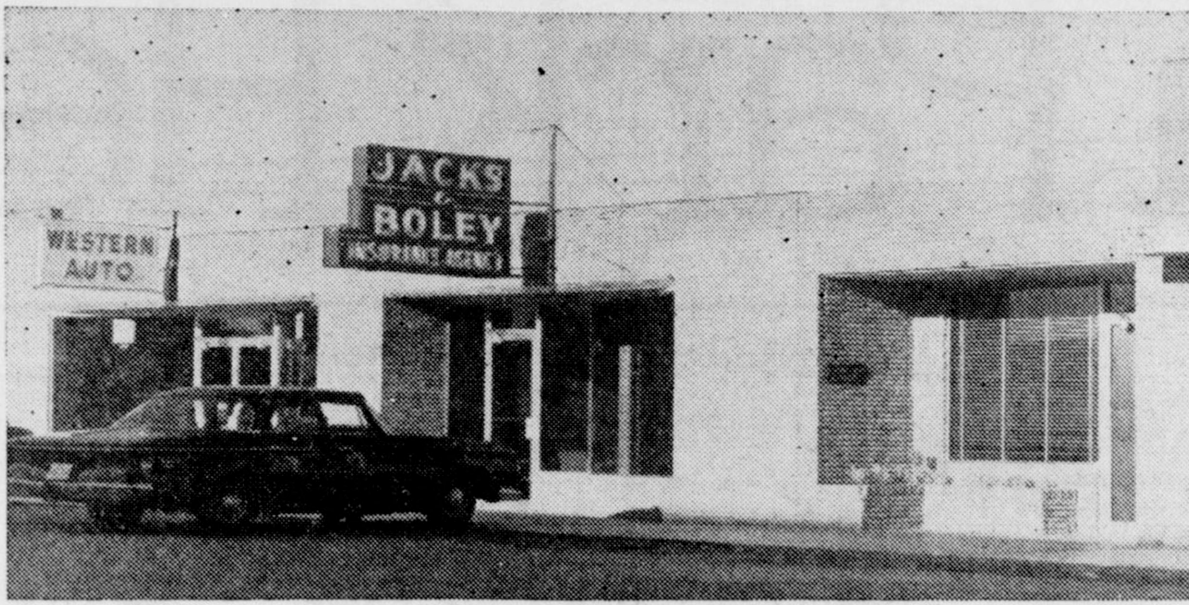

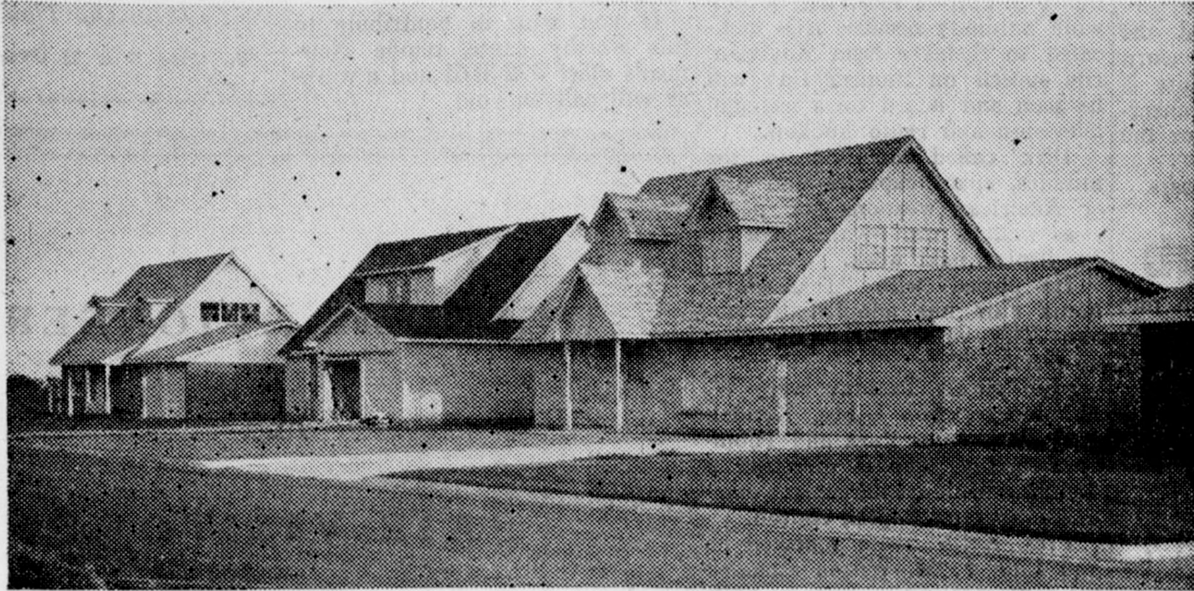

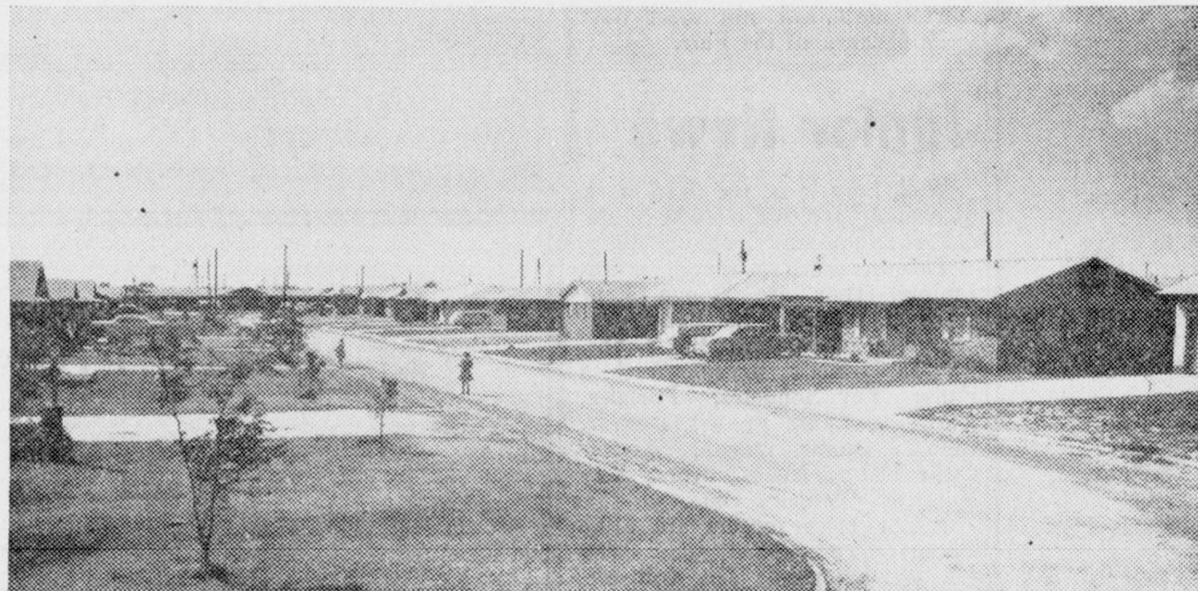

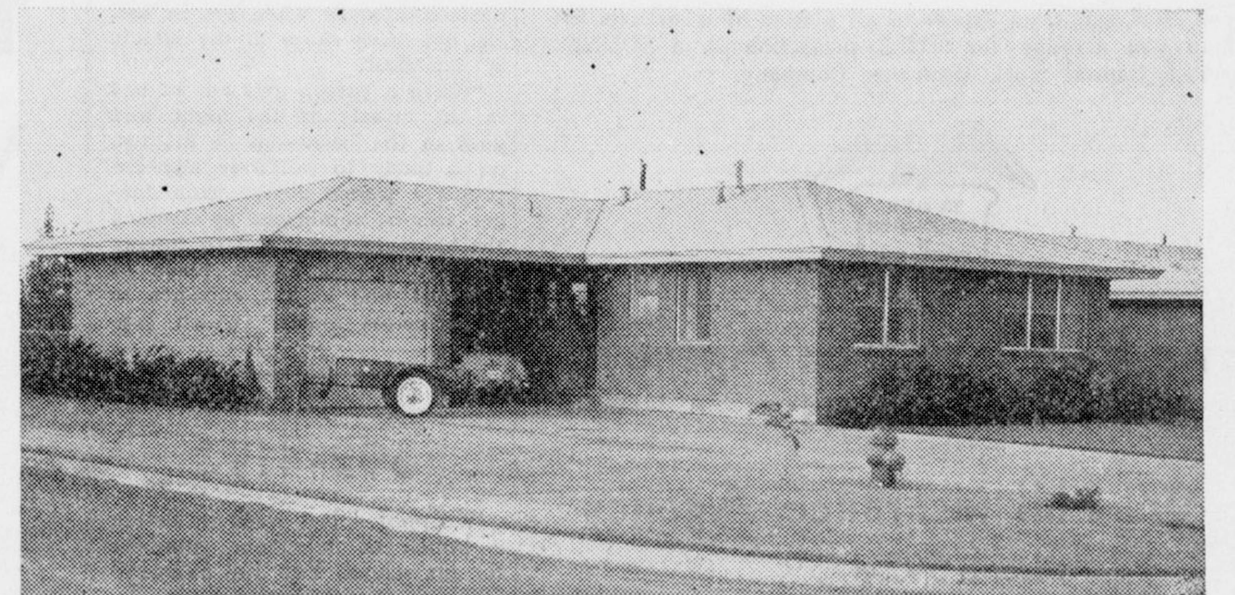

Left to Right: The homes of Mrs Bertha Black, Roy Crabtree and Lee Lovell



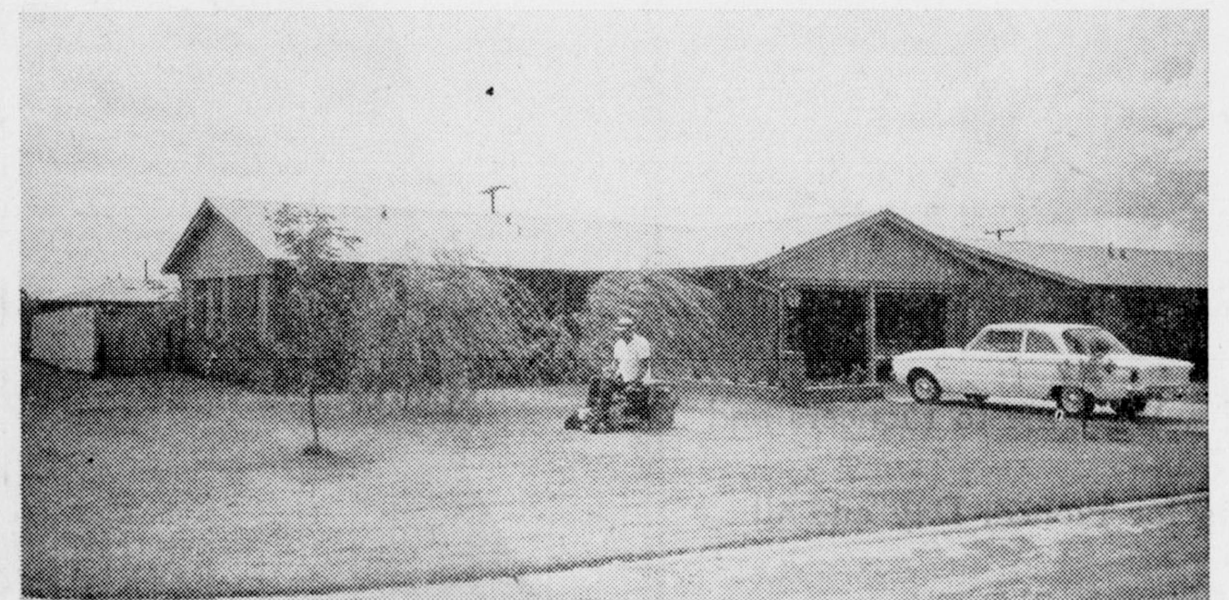

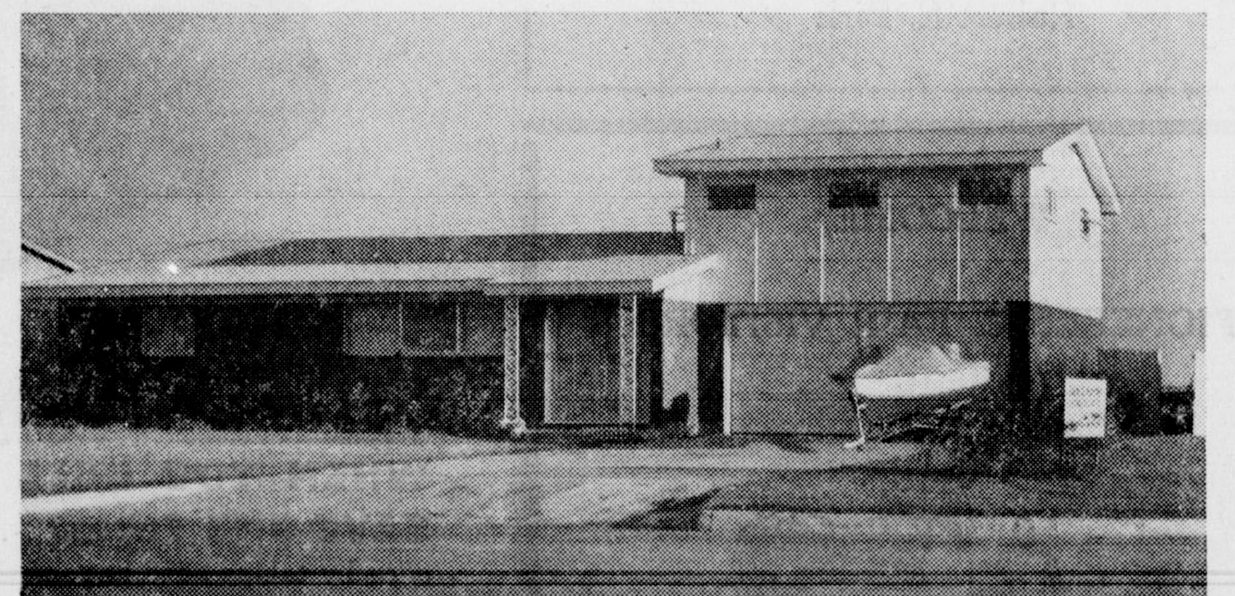
