Wichita County voters cast their ballots in the future.
This year the standard 14
inches by 22 inch balot will be replaced by cards measuring 3 inches by 12 which will be fed
into Vote-A-Matics.
The ballot card will be fed into a slot on the machine, and voters will mark their decisions by punching holes by corresponding alternatives.
It's all very simple, but for

to a court consisting of eight judges and a presiding judge The proposal would authorize the enlarged court of nine judges to sit in panels of three judges for the purpose of hearing cases with
two judges constituting two judges constituting
quorum and the concurrence of two judges necessary for decision.
Arguments for Amendmen
No. 1 are that immediate
unburdening of the court o
achieve speedy justice, snd the achieve speedy justice, and that the proposal provides the most
efficient and economical method of relieving the pressure on Texas' system of appellate review.
Argume
Arguments against the first proposal come from some uthorities who believe the xpansion of the court canno favor two levels of review for criminal cases by providing for intermediate appellate review of riminal cases.
Amendment No. 2 would
authorize the Veteran's Land oard to issue and sell an ditional $\$ 200$-million in bonds. The additional $\$ 200$-million in bonds or obligations authorized would extend the maximum amount of bonds or obligations to
the state for the Veterans' Land

Fund from the existing $\$ 500$ million to $\$ 700$-million. Also, the unmarried surviving spouse of a
veteran who died in the line of duty would also become eligible to apply for purchase of a tract through the board. Primary argument in favor of the second proposal is that in
order to continue the program order to continue the program and to extend its benefits to
those veterans who were efigible under the program but for whom money was unavailable for a loan because of the fund's depletion, it should be approved. Surviving spouses should be
given the same privileges of given the same privileges of
acquiring land for themselves as has previously been available only to veterans.
