BRYAN AS A POLITICAL ECONOMIST.

FOUR years ago Tuesday, October 9, 1896, Mr Bryan, then as now candidate for the presidency, addressed the farmers of Huron, S. D. Among other things he said: "So long as the gold standard prevails there must be a general fall of prices of agricultural products...

At that time wheat was selling in Chicago at 67 1/2, corn at 22 1/2, and mess pork at 6.70. Four years later wheat was quoted in Chicago at 75 1/2, corn at 41, and mess pork at 16.00.

When Mr. Bryan made his speech to the Huron farmers Denver & Rio Grande common stock was selling at 10 1/2; four years later it was worth 18 1/2.

Some Other Jefferson. (New York Sun.) We quote from a letter written by Mr. Isaac Love Straus to the Baltimore Sun the subjoined paragraph: "Mr. Jefferson is probably the most conspicuous opponent in history of the colonial system."

Mr. Straus must mean some other Jefferson than Thomas Jefferson, the Father of Imperialism, the bold innovator, who, after acquiring by purchase the vast Louisiana territory, discussed its future as follows in a letter of July, 1803, to Gen. Horatio Gates: "With respect to the territory acquired, I do not think it will be a separate government, as you imagine, I presume the island of New Orleans, and the settled country on the opposite bank, will be annexed to the Mississippi Territory."

Thus were the colonial idea and the system of subject dependencies simultaneously introduced by Thomas Jefferson, and his programme has been carried out for nearly a century, surviving the experiment, if we are not misinformed.

Mr. Straus must mean some other Jefferson than the Thomas Jefferson who discarded utterly the theory that the Constitution follows the flag of its own unaided force, and believed with McKinley in the gradual extension of American principles to newly acquired territory, colonies, and dependencies, as is shown by the letter he wrote in November, 1893, to Albert Gallatin, wherein he said: "The territory was purchased by the country (Louisiana purchase) being now in force, the new legislature will, of course, in due time, by jury in criminal cases, first, the habeas corpus, the freedom of the press, freedom of religion, etc., as soon as a general draw of the laws and organizations to the mould of ours by degrees, as they find practicable, without exciting too much discontent."

Finally the Jefferson of whom the Baltimore lawyer speaks as the most conspicuous opponent in history of the colonial system, cannot possibly be the Thomas Jefferson who, by the acquisition of this territory, said: "The territory was purchased by the United States in their capacity, and they disposed of it by their pleasure. It is in the nature of a colony whose commerce may be regulated by any reference to the Constitution."

Mr. Straus, like Mr. Bryan, probably considers himself a Democrat, but his acquaintance with the theories and practices of Thomas Jefferson seems to be mighty limited.

General Black a Valuable Ally.

(Chicago Times Herald.) The determination of General John C. Black to stump the state for the Republican candidates is likely to have a great influence upon the result. A TOUGH PROPOSITION.

MR. BRYAN has reached a point in his campaign where he appeals to the unfortunate to destroy the prosperity of their more happy fellow citizens.

That is not an unfair interpretation of his speech at Quincy, Ill., where his allusion to the faces of careworn women who never get a chance to take a summer vacation on some pleasant watering place, was followed by a mention of the policies which are today amassing great wealth in the hands of a few people with a rapidity never before known in the history of the world.

Mr. Bryan's idea of the American people is that they are a sort of blind Sampson, toiling in chains, and that their most immediate political duty is to bring down in ruins the national temple, burying themselves with their oppressors in the ruins.

If Mr. Bryan knows how it would help poor people to summer vacations, to close the factories, wreck the savings banks, destroy the profits of the railroads, and substitute primitive methods of industrial and business organization in place of those now existing, he has not yet condescended to impart this valuable information to a listening public.

General Harrison knows that the United States, wisely or unwisely, acquired the title to the Philippines by the treaty of peace with Spain. He knows also that our flag there, raised for war or woe, is being attacked by the guerrillas under Aguinaldo. That being the situation, he will neither rise at the flag himself nor hold up Aguinaldo's gun.

Bryan has no such patriotic scruples. It wants office. To get it it must oppose the administration, and this it does not hesitate to do on the very field where American soldiers are giving their lives in the flag's defence. Bryanism daily and hourly sends cheers across the Pacific ocean to Aguinaldo, hopes for his success and promises, if Aguinaldo cannot win himself, that he shall have victory at Bryan's hands.

General Harrison believes that the independence of the Philippines is a proper subject for debate in congress when the United States sovereignty is no longer assailed. Bryan argues for it from Aguinaldo's side of the firing line. Can any natural hearted American hesitate to take the side of Harrison? Can any man of dispassionate sense fail to see that now is the time to crush the free silver of Bryanism?

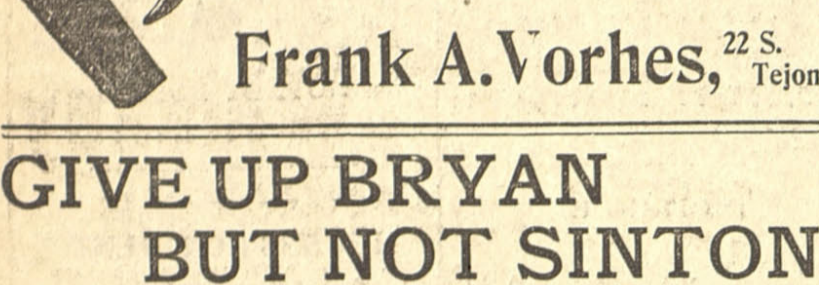
