MINING MATTERS.

THE MONTANA. Jesse Love went to work yesterday on the Montana up Silver creek.

THE POLAR STAR. Old John Schelle is still pegging away on his Polar Star claim in Horse Gulch. He has a tunnel in 95 feet on a vein of black manganese.

THE ALMA MATER. Since striking the vein in the Alma Mater cross-cut, Messrs. Thompson and Hicks have been drifting both east and west on the vein, and are saving some ore that will pay to ship.

THE ST. LOUIS. A. V. Gorla and Gus Misch have been working on the St. Louis this week and will continue. They have a shaft down 70 feet at the end of a 75 foot tunnel.

THE SANTA CLARA WILL WORK. It may be set down as an assured fact that the Santa Clara mill will run all during the summer and fall.

THE GRAND VIEW CROSS-CUT. The cross-cut on the Grand View was run into Nigger Baby Hill 300 feet, and from that point two cross-cuts were run, one in an easterly direction for the Grand View and another westerly for the Phoenix vein.

SAMPLING AT THE PASADENA. The Pasadena will sample on Monday next, having received various lots of ore from the C. H. C., Lelia Davis, Dayton, Pigeon, and other mines.

THE WEST DOLORES. The West Dolores camp is showing up some good ore this winter. F. J. Walker came over from there last Saturday and reports that Warren Rose and Pete Cherrubino have struck some sulphure ore in what they think is an extension of the Emma.

THE GRAND VIEW, OF ICE LAKE. The sale of the Grand View and Columbus gold claims in Ice Lake Basin did not go through last summer, and the property is now under bond.

THE ETHLENA. Quite unexpectedly last Saturday, the Ethlena shaft struck a contact at a depth of 38 feet. They believe that it is the C. H. C. contact, for which the shaft was driving, but it was not expected to strike the vein in less than 80 feet.

MUM'S TWO. The workings of two of Rico's best mines, both producers, will for a time be kept out of these columns, at the special and urgent request of owners and lessees.

RICO TUNNEL CO. The projectors of the enterprise to run a tunnel into Expectation mountain held a meeting last Sunday afternoon in the Armory and elected a board of directors for the first year.

DURING January six counties in the state returned bounty certificates to the state treasurer for \$9,883.14. Over \$5,000 of this was for loco. It will be different this year.

ORDINANCE NO. 70. AN ORDINANCE CONCERNING MINORS.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Rico:

SECTION 1.—That if any saloon, bar-room, billiard hall, bowling alley, keeper, or the proprietor or manager of any theatre, show, gambling house, house of ill-fame or place where obscene plays are performed, or any other place where liquors are sold, within the limits of said Town of Rico, shall permit any minor to frequent or be present at, or to drink any intoxicating or malt liquors, or to engage or participate in any game of billiards, or in any game, bet or wager, with any cards or other gambling device, or any other game whatsoever, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and on conviction shall be subject to a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars for the first offense, and for the second offense shall forfeit his license, and such license shall not be renewed for sixty days.

SECTION 2.—That if any saloon, billiard hall, saloon, house of prostitution, dance house, keeper, or the proprietor of any place where intoxicating or malt liquors are sold, or the agents or clerks of any such proprietors or keepers shall sell or permit to be sold in his, her or their place of business to any minor any such liquors, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars for each offense.

SECTION 3.—That any minor who shall be found in any billiard saloon, bar-room, bowling alley, house of ill-fame or place where obscene plays are performed within the limits of said town, during the hours of 9 o'clock in the evening and 5 o'clock in the morning, unless able to give a lawful excuse therefor, or who shall frequent or be found in any saloon, billiard hall, house of ill-fame, bowling alley or place where obscene plays are performed, participating in any game or bet, or drinking or eating or using liquors either in the day or night time, shall be arrested and tried before the Police Magistrate of said town, and upon conviction shall be fined in a sum not less than one nor more than ten dollars for each offense.

SECTION 4.—That it shall be the duty of the Marshal and all the policemen of the Town of Rico, to arrest with or without warrant all persons found violating this ordinance, and imprison the offenders for trial, as in cases of other violations of the ordinances of the said Town of Rico.

SECTION 5.—All keepers of places enumerated in the foregoing ordinance shall place a sign, where prominent and visible in their place of business, containing the following words, viz: "NO MINORS ALLOWED HERE." Any violation of this section shall be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars or more than one hundred dollars.

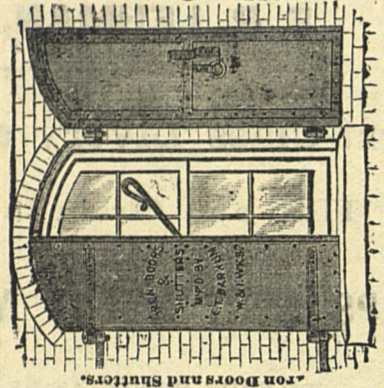
