A CONCENTRATOR. A new concentrator will be erected somewhere in this vicinity within the next two months by Messrs. T. Steedman G. W. Bemis.

ORDINANCE NO. 65. An ordinance amending Section Four (4) of Ordinance No. sixteen (16) concerning Licenses. Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the town of Rico: SECTION 1.—That Section Four [4] of Ordinance No. 16, be and the same is hereby amended by adding thereto so as to read as follows: "The payment of licenses for the sale of spirituous, vinous, fermented and intoxicating liquors, and to keep Dance Halls, billiard and pool tables, ball alleys, bagatelle or pigeon-hole tables and shooting galleries shall be made quarterly in advance."
