Finally overcoming the frequent June rains, Hansford County farmers finished the 1986 wheat harvest with a
surprisingly high quality crop. surprisingly high quality crop.
Elevator surpervisors stated thought the wheat is 100 percent finished. Most everyone should have finished Saturday or Sunday. Area farm experts reported the wheat
crop, which most had anticipated as crop, which most had anticipated as
having a poor quality, ending up much better than predictions.
Overall, it was alot better than
everyone had anticipated and hoped for. Most people felt the crop wasn't going Most people felt the crop wasn't going
to be very good due to the lack of rains," explained one area farm expert.
"Overall yields were pretty good, too The dryland averaged probably $15-20$ (bushel per acre) and that sure is pretty
good especially considering the dry year we had," experts observed.
"March, April, and May were dry months and moisture during that time period is essential for the development of wheat." "Our biggest limiting factor for the
wheat crop was the lack of rain. Starting about in March and April, the rain is really needed.
Another minor factor was the discovery of the Russian wheat aphid in the county.
The ap
most deid is reported to be one of the most destructive things for wheat. A
field that probably would have produced 60 but will end up producing only 20 thanks to these aphids.
Hansford County was lucky not to
have very much severe damage from these little pests.

Voters will have two issues o decide - whether or not to approve the bonds and a tax ate to pay off the note.
The Palo Duro authority has a proposal from the Texas Water Development
Board to buy the bonds for 7.6 percent - about one percent below the conventional bond market, reports Johnnie Lee of Spearman, DRA manager.
He adds that the payback eriod would run for 25
"Ths will save the river authority a considerable amount of tax dollars," he reports. "The municipal 8.5 percent for periods of 15 to 20 years."
The proposition to use Texas Water Plan funds to purchase the PDRA construcion bonds has developed over the past three to four Lee and-Charles Neimer, executive director of the Texas Water Development Board; Reg Arnold, executive director of the Texas Water Development Fund, and Dr. Herb Grubb, chief planner for the Texas Lee explains that Lee explains that the

That request is due a pub ic hearing on July 17 in Au tin before the Texas Wate Development Commission. If approved, the project to develop a municipa ties of Dumas, Cactus, Sunray, Stinnett, Gruver and Spearman will become the first in Texas to use the water fund which Texan approved last November. by the PDRA calls for construction of a 4,900 -foot long earthen dam at the junction of Palo Duro Creek and Horse Creck, which is loca Hansford county county
The dam will create a lake with 2,500 surface
acres with much of the shoreline surrounding the lake developed for recrea tion use. PDRA board members are advancing a plan to build the dam now anderal water supply system at a future date when the lake begins to fill.

South Africa's segregration policy is that they will hurt more blacks than whites

such action. The same is other states bordering on South Africa, to varying degrecs. That's Arrica, to varying degrees. Thar's posed sanctions - these black countries. Quietly, many government officials in them want token sanctions but oppose broad sanctions by the European Community and America.
the "Christian Science Monitor" says some top officials in these states admit they oppose tough sanctions, though publicly supporting the idea. That's because blacks would suffer much more than whites.

This is probably why the "Iron Lady," - Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher - stuck to her guns and, with West German support, suc cessfully thwarted a move by the European Community in June to impose broad sanctions. Despite the threat from one common wealth prime minister to leave the her policy, convinced that sanc her policy, convinced will not work and will harm blacks, in South Africa and elsewhere, more than whites.

It's easy to demagogue on this issue and charges of hypocrisy fly back and forth. Reformers in the U.S., such as Gary Hart demon strating in front of the South African Embassy in Washington, should remember that it costs hem nothing if the economy of other black states. And it costs them nothing if large numbers jobs, black and white, are lost in South Africa.

Turn Leftovers Into"Pl Most of us refrigerate left-over fool for one of two reasons: either we want to postpone washing the dish it's in or we feel guilty about throwing away perfectly good food. But when food sits in the refrigerator too long, we often wind up throwing it away anyway

A better system for handling left overs is to think of them as "planned overs." Here are some suggestions for planning to make good use of leftover food before it goes to waste: to buy for your household. If you buy an extra amount of a certain food because it's on sale, perpare two batches of the same dish and freeze one. Label and date the frozen dish. Then keep a

## Smoking Down

The news on the tobacco ad diction front is good. The Army buildings except in specially designated areas. It's estimated that in the last five years one-third of all American businesses have restricted smoking on the job. Another 21 percent, according o the Bureau of National Affairs, plans to do so.
A survey of high school seniors shows that by 1984 the percentage of students who smoked dropped
