





D.R. Meredith was born in Eastern Okla., and is the granddaughter of a pioneer who rode in a covered wagon during the famous run of April 22, 1889, when Oklahoma was opened to homesteaders. She now lives in Dumas, Texas, the heart of the Panhandle, and her knowledge of the life and lore of the Texas Panhandle gives her book. The Sheriff And The Panhandle Murders, an unusually rich atmosphere. In this book, Sheriff Charles Timothy Matthews was glad to leave the stress and sprawl of Dallas, and some unpleasant memories, for the quiet of Carroll, a small West Texas town. Nestled deep in the heart of the Panhandle, a day's drive from the big city Matthews left behind, Crawford County hadn't seen anyone murdered in cold blood for more than 80 years.
