teenth Judicial District during the 1940's. The first homes in the town of Hansf ord were built by
Fred Bonfill who was promoting the area at the time. Bonfill had a concern in New York City which encouraged new handle area.

built in 1883. The house was built of natural rock. The building of the courthuuse of Old Hansford turn-
ed into a serious problem. The construction was neat completion in 1891 when a cyclone blew the structure down, with no money to reburud thered and the construction began again on a story and a half building. But when the second courthouse was near completion a second cyclone ripped the roof and

storm the lower parthad been completed and M.B. Wright storm the lower parthad been completed and M.B. Wright
was holding a school class on the lower floor. When the building finally received the finishing touches it became an office for the county business. Being the largest structure of the area it also turned into a social center

Another railroad came through the southwestern part and conty and the town of Morse began to prosper where Gruver stands and Gruver soon became a thriving town. With better transportation and conveniences being
added year by year the small communities became only remains and memories.
