## CITIZENS' REASONS.

Ten Reasons Why the Voters of Artesia Should Elect Citizens' Ticket Next



In setting hens the forepart of this month, not more than thirteen eggs should be given them, as the nights are still chilly, and the hens can not always command sufficient leat properly to take care of a larger setting of eggs.

Before setting a hen, clean up each nest, scrub it out, and sift a quart of coal ashes into the bottom. Then make a mat of news papers, saturate well with kerosene and place in the bottom of the nest and upon this sift, another quandupon the sift and place in the bottom of the nest and upon this sift another quan-tity of ashes, and then fill up with bright straw or other nesting ma-terial. 
