Jury Releases the Bartender Who Shot and Killed Juan Acosa.--Claim Ray Shot Acosta in Self Defense
Holly Ray, who shot and kille Juan Acosta on March 16, wa
declared "Not Guilty" Saturday night by the jury at to:55 o'clock. Ray shot Acosta twice in the Bank saloon, and the Mexican
died the next day in the Eddy county hospital.
Ray on the night of the shoot-

Stewart was sheriff of Eddy conn Ay, and at one time had arrested costa for some trivial offense; and

that shortly before he was killed Acosta appeared in the saloon where Ray was working and
threatened his life. The Mexican was intoxicated when he left the
saloon, and in a few minutes put in his appearance again, coming in at a side door, when Ra fired two shots, both taking effect.

fense of his own life, and asked repeatedly in the jail as to the
