

"Quitaque was an ascent of the great escarp ment through a gap in Cap Rock to the top of the Staked Plains in Southeast Briscoe County near the Northeast corner of Llano from the lower lying Prairie Plains (4) "Quiraque also lies just west of where the High Plains and the Prairie Plains on, and where many rivers with branching heads originate like arger streams called Red. Pease. and the Salt and Double Mount (5) which includes the Quitaque and Linguish Rivers. "In general it lies to the north of the thirtyecond parallel latitude and be tween the ninety-nineth and one hundred and second degree of longitude, west of Greenwich. It is the borderland of the High Prairie Plains. (6) Quitaque can truly be called the Queen City

Just north of the present War-ren W. Merrell home south of Quitaque, the Indians used to raise corn. They dammed the Quitaque River, and dug an enormous dich to their fields. With this irrigation the Indians orn. (8)
