## in 20 months

Big moves are not unusual on the Santa Fe. Citrus, potash, coal, sulphur and various manufactured products move by the trainloads. But grain tops them all, especially wheat.

This year marks the one hundredth anniversary of Turkey Red Wheat in the United States. Through the efforts of the Santa Fe back in 1874, the Mennonites emigrated from Russia and brought with them a few sacks of their wheat. Big moves also require modern diesel power, automated yards and skillful people to get the job done. All of this is now at work as Santa Fe continues at a record pace moving billions of the many things needed and used every day by the people of our nation.
