Our mayor, Mr. Edwards, along with other personnel, have been meeting with the Lubbock City Council. They are discussing the dispatching of Lubbock fire trucks to rural farms and rural communities. Apparently, as it stands at the present, the dependance on Lubbock fire dependance on Lubbock to be equipment is going
prohibitive from the standpoint of cost. It seems as if the only area of solution for the small or outlying communities at the present time is to buy more equipment and to train more men for this vital job.
The Wolfforth fire department is now having an Army surplus truck renovated to carry water as a baçk-up for the fire truck they are now using. This will be a great help when there are no fire hydrants for the truck to hook up
