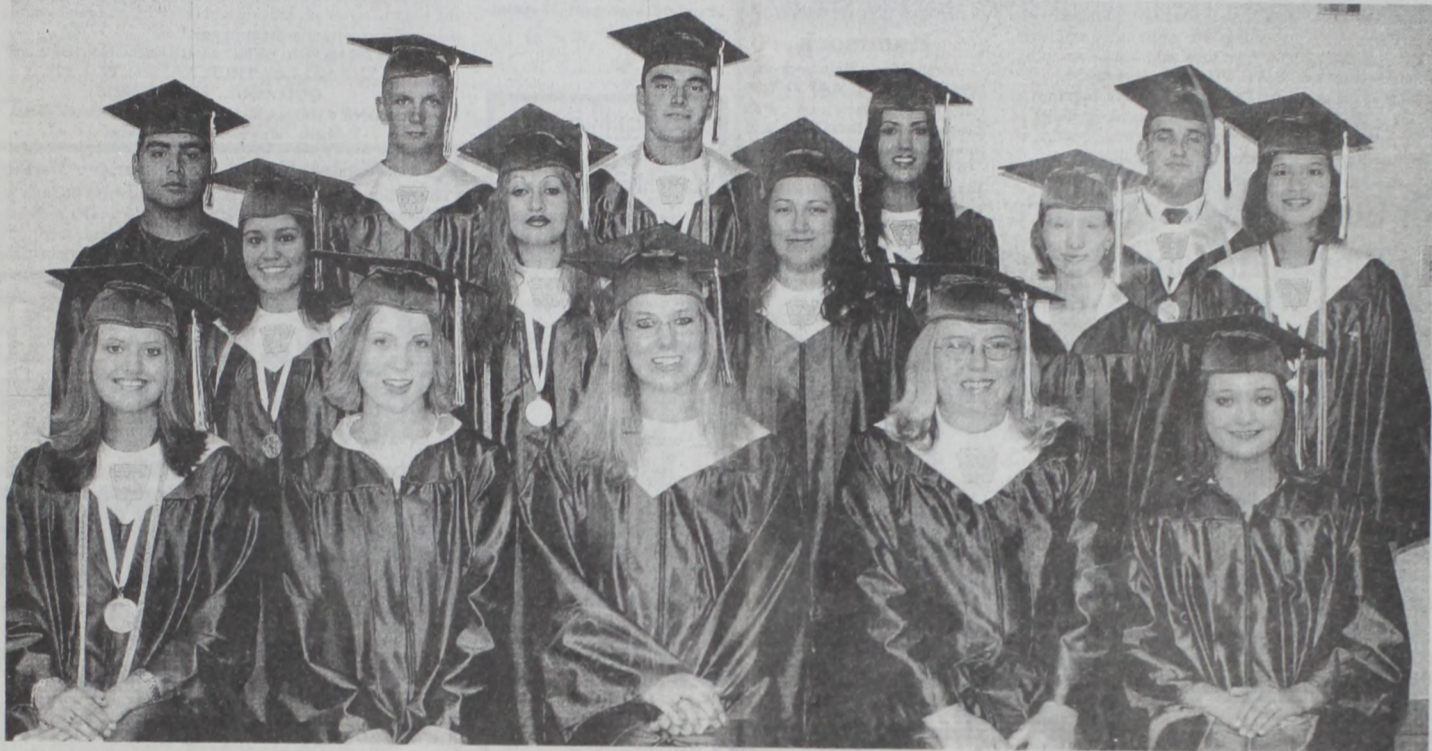

# Cooks Corner

No matter how busy we are, those of us who don't live near fast-food outlets still have to cook dinner every evening. I've gathered up some recipes for "quick" food, and the whole meal can be ready in 30 minutes. This week's meal includes Mushroom Beef Stroganoff, Herb Tossed Salad and, for dessert, Candy Bar Croissants. Your family will like it, and you won't be in the kitchen very long.

## MUSHROOM BEEF STROGANOFF

2 tablespoons butter or margarine  
1 tablespoon Crisco oil  
1-1/2 pounds sirloin steak, thinly sliced  
1 pound fresh mushrooms, sliced  
1 can (10-3/4 oz.) condensed cream of mushroom soup, undiluted  
2 cups sour cream  
1 cup chopped green onions  
1/2 teaspoon dried thyme  
1/2 teaspoon dried marjoram  
Hot cooked noodles or rice  
In a large skillet, heat butter and oil over medium-high heat. Brown steak; remove with a slotted spoon and keep warm. Add mushrooms; saute until tender. Return steak to pan. Add soup, sour cream, onions, thyme and marjoram; heat gently, but do not boil. Serve over noodles or rice. Serves 6. TIP: Beef is easier to slice thin if it is partially frozen.

## HERBED TOSSED SALAD

1 cup tarragon or cider vinegar  
1 cup vegetable oil  
1 garlic clove, minced  
2 teaspoons minced fresh oregano OR 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon minced fresh basil OR 1/4 teaspoon dried basil  
1/2 teaspoon minced fresh parsley  
Mixed salad greens  
Sliced cucumber and sweet red pepper  
In a jar with a tight-fitting lid, combine the first seven ingredients; shake well. In a large salad bowl, combine greens, cucumber and red pepper. Drizzle with dressing; toss to coat. Makes about 1-1/3 cups dressing.

## CANDY BAR CROISSANTS

1 tube refrigerated crescent rolls  
1 tablespoon butter or margarine, softened  
2 plain Hershey bars (1.55 ounces each), broken into small pieces  
1 egg, beaten  
2 tablespoons sliced almonds  
Unroll crescent roll dough; separate into triangles. Brush with butter. Arrange candy bar pieces evenly over triangles; roll up from the wide end. Place point side down on a greased baking sheet; curve ends slightly. Brush with egg and sprinkle with almonds. Bake at 375 for 11-13 minutes or until golden brown. Cool on a wire rack. Makes 8.

**High Plains Planting Progress Slow: Producers Look For Planting Rains To Arrive**

It is still premature to say how the 2003 High Plains cotton crop will fair since a large part of the area has yet to be planted.

What is becoming clearer everyday, however, is that in order for producers to take advantage of a relatively decent subsoil moisture situation Mother Nature is going to have to come through with a decent starter.

With little to no rainfall activity occurring over the May 14-16 time frame it is back to a wait and see approach for High Plains producers.

Weather forecasts for May 14-16 indicated the best chance in quite some time for rain to fall over an extended area of the High Plains. With nothing of consequence materializing producers will continue to wait for something good to happen.

Time is still on the growers side, but another week or two without significant rainfall and the situation will take on a considerably darker complexion.

A current estimate of planted acres indicates that probably not more than 700,000 acres, of an expected 3.5 million plus acres to be devoted to cotton, have yet been planted. Dryland acres as a whole remain basically unplanted, while the majority of the progress to date has been on irrigated acreage.

One interesting situation impacting some producers who have installed drip irrigation systems is an inability to get enough moisture to the top of the planting bed. Dry weather and the force of gravity are causing considerable consternation for those growers who did not retain any alternative irrigation options when making the conversion to drip irrigation systems.

But you are only allowed to dismiss one ticket per calendar year by taking a driving safety course."
