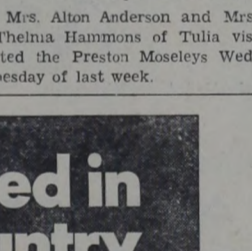

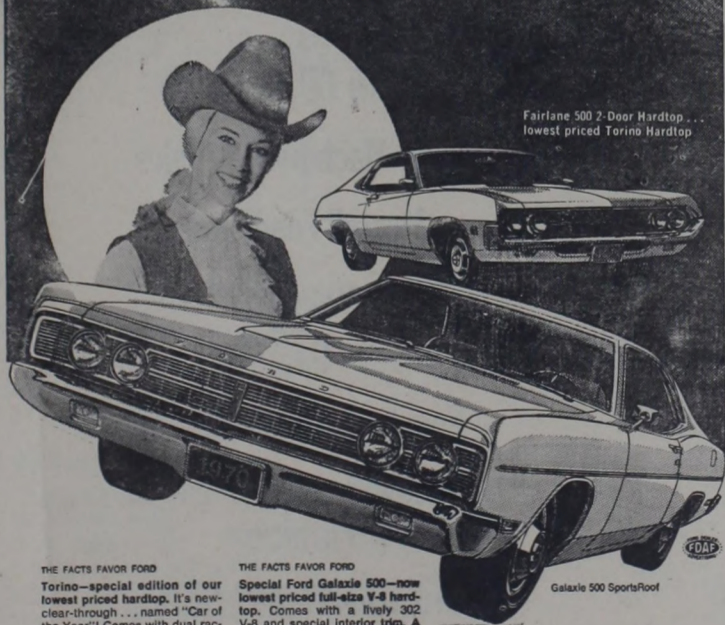

Home Demonstration Agent
With the Briscoe County 4-H Foods Show less than a month away, the foods projects are in full swing.

The first- and third-year project groups in Quitaque, led by Mrs. Dale Smith, are planning a party for the Will Power 4-H Club which will meet Monday, February 16, 1970. The program will be presented by the Quitaque Boy Scouts.

Mrs. Elton Cantwell's first-year class will be studying the fruit and vegetable group this week. With the help of Junior Leader Debbie Cantwell, the girls will prepare fruits and vegetables at their meeting.

Another first-year group is led by Mrs. Leo Fleming. They are exploring foods, "The Picnic Way." Mrs. Fleming's class will be planning and preparing main dishes for picnics during their lesson this week.

Mrs. H. M. Vaughn's class has concluded their study of the four food groups. The girls will entertain their guests at a picnic later this month.

Mrs. B. J. Boling and Junior Leader Debbie Boling are also leading a first-year foods group. They are planning to study and prepare fruits and vegetables at their meeting this week. In addition to learning how to prepare

foods, the 4-H'ers also learn what contribution each food makes to good health, and how to plan a balanced diet.

Second-year foods leaders are Mrs. Claude Jarrett and Teen Leader Pat Jarrett. These two groups are studying the project, "4-H Food and Fun." They will be learning more advanced food preparation.

The third- and fourth-year groups are led by Mrs. Alvie Francis. They are studying "Outdoor and Indoor Meals" as their project. Along with food preparation, this project involves a deeper study of the science of nutrition.

All 4-H'ers who have carried the foods project more than four years do a "Self Determined" project. Each member studies some specific area of special interest to her. These girls will enter foreign dishes in the Food Show.

The County Food Show is tentatively set for March 14, 1970. Each 4-H'er will enter a dish that she has prepared by herself. She will serve it correctly with the proper table appointments. During judging, each participant will tell the nutritional value of the food she has prepared.

Plan now to attend the Food Show and see for yourself what these young people are learning.
