**SHIRT TAIL SERMON**

"Judge not, that you be not judged." Matthew 7:1  
 Our Lord is here giving fair warning to all who will hear that as we think of our fellowman, we should not allow ourselves the privilege of judging the rightness or wrongness of his actions and words. There are many reasons for this, but we will here set forth four reasons.

First, judge not because you are not in possession of all the facts. There may be facts that are not evident to the passing eye that have led, or even forced, the man to do the thing that he has done. The American Indian is said to have a saying: "Do not judge a man until you have walked a mile in his moccasins." Under the same circumstances, we might have done or said the same thing (or worse) than our fellowman said or did.

Second, judge not because the

time for the trial is not yet. A life should not be judged until it is finished. Man is given the opportunity to make restitution for his wrongs; in other words, he is given the chance to repent of his sins. Repentance abolishes the consequences of sin because Jesus has already atoned for those sins.

Third, judge not because, if you do, you yourself will be judged. You will be judged in the same manner that you have judged. If you have not shown mercy in your judgment, you will be shown no mercy. Someone has said, "On the Judgment Day, I do not desire justice, but mercy." Justice would demand payment for sins as well as offer reward for virtue but mercy demands temperance of justice.

Fourth, judge not because a higher Tribunal has that privilege. "Vengeance is mine," saith the Lord. When the Book of Life is opened and all our deeds are laid bare, the Lord will pronounce our

fate. And there is no appeal for this is the High Court of Heaven. Roy R. Havens

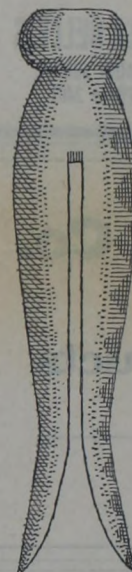
