> Third, we often hear the word 'transgression' used to describe sin. This word originally carried the idea of "falling by the way side". "All we like sheep have gone astray." says God's Word, and someone mentioned that strayed sheep never have the tendency to turn back, but rather stray farther. Jesus had to come and die, showing us the "narrow way"

When we take somehing good and twist it around and uso it in a bad or evil woy we have committed the act of perversion. 


