## Shirttail Sermon

In the midst of a world of heavily used four letter words lurks a smaller word of only three letters. —sin. Religious circles shun, neglect, dislike, and refuse to accept this little noun found in the Bible. All the while they forget that it is because of these three letters that the Bible was given to man, that Christ died, and that we must search for a d find peace with God. Understanding the meaning of sin might help us to evaluate and improve the condition of our spiritual lives.

First, we might say that sin is egocentric. Jesus said if we are to follow after him we must "deny" ourselves. To build a life around self with no consideration for God's will is sin.

Second, rebellion against God could describe sin. Originally, the Jewish word for sin literally

meant to "miss the mark." The Bible says, "For all have sinned (missed the mark) and come short of the glory (character) of God." Our target in life is to be God-like, and when we miss the target we have sinned.

Third, we often hear the word "transgression" used to describe sin. This word originally carried the idea of "falling by the way-side". Jesus said, "narrow is the way that leadeth unto life," reminding us that God's way is difficult. "All we like sheep have gone astray," says God's Word, and someone mentioned that strayed sheep never have the tendency to turn back, but rather stray farther. Jesus had to come and die, showing us the "narrow way" back to God. Should we choose to ignore God's way in favor of

straying after our own desires, this is sin.

Fourth, sin could be spoken of in terms of iniquity. Iniquity is an older form of our modern word "perversion". When we take something good and twist it around and use it in a bad or evil way we have committed the act of perversion. We may use the lives God gives each of us in a way that would please Him, or we might do things to displease Him. We displease the Lord when we use sound bodies and good minds in bad or evil ways and this is sin.

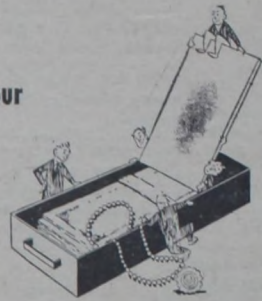

**- Home Notes -**

**MONTERRY CASSEROLE**  
1-lb. ground beef

3/4 teaspoon seasoned salt  
2 cups grated cheese  
1/2 cup ripe olives  
Cherry tomatoes  
2 T. chopped onion  
2 cans (8 oz.) tomato sauce  
4 cups taco flavored tortilla chips  
Green peper rings

Cook beef in skillet 5 minutes until crumbly and light in color. Add onion, salt and tomato sauce. Place 3 cups tortilla chips in a 2-quart casserole. Sprinkle 1 cup grated cheese over tortilla chips. Pour meat sauce over and top with the remaining cup of tortilla chips. Bake at 350° for 15-20 minutes. Garnish with olives, tomatoes and green pepper rings. Serves 6.

**HINTS ON SERVING MEAT**  
Use a platter which conforms to the basic shape of the meat and which is not too much larger than the meat itself. This makes the piece of meat look bigger.

Allow a roast to set 10-15 minutes after cooking before you slice it. It will slice much easier.

Serve meat with an attractive garnish such as:  
Baskets made from oranges. These are especially pretty filled with parsley.  
Broiled peach halves.

Whole pickled peaches.  
Small bunches of grapes.  
Make flowers from cherry tomatoes by cutting quarters almost to the bottom. Arrange with parsley or water cress leaves.
