### Former Congressman Appointed Assistant Attorney General

Attorney General Jim Mattox has announced the appointment of former U. S. Congressman Jack Hightower as first assistant attorney general.

Mattox also named Mary F. Keller as executive assistant for litigation, the first woman ever to hold the position of overseeing and supervising all litigation for the Attorney General's office.

Hightower, of Vernon, was sworn in to the first assistant's position by Judge Tom G. Davis of the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals during a news conference November 19.

Hightower served in Congress as the representative of the 13th Congressional District of Texas, covering 33 counties in West Texas, beginning with the 94th Congress in 1975. He served on the important House Appropriations Committee and its Defense subcommittee.

## Sesquicentennial Planning Meeting Well Attended

Several interested citizens met Monday night at the Community Center in Quitaque to discuss projects and events for the upcoming Sesquicentennial in 1986. The State of Texas will be 150 years old. Preparation has begun all over the state to promote the birthday celebration.

Janice Henson presided over the meeting and presented several things that the community can do. Some events decided on were Tree Planting on Arbor Day, January 17; Independence Day Observance, March 2; a Sesquicentennial poster contest; a special edition of the Valley Tribune (everyone is being asked to start now to go through old newspapers, letters, anything that has happened in the Quitaque area over the last 150 years and take them to the Valley Tribune); revitalization of Main Street and a clean-up of the town; collecting taped reminiscences of the whole community

and the area's eldest settlers; a Fourth of July celebration for the entire community. A museum project was adopted for the Sesquicentennial year. The editor of the Valley Tribune has had numerous suggestions for a museum in Quitaque through personal contact or through letters. A committee will be appointed to look into this project.

Quitaque, together with Silverton, is planning a County-wide celebration for August 9, 1986, to be held at the courthouse in Silverton. This will be an all-day celebration with arts and crafts bazaar, antique display, a parade, a community choir concert, barbecue, old fiddlers contest, fireworks, and other events to be announced at a later date.

This is a community project and everyone is needed to make this next year a success and one to be remembered. Everyone is asked to get involved in one or all of these events and projects.

Remind Your Crew to Play it Safe Around Electricity.



Don't leave lights unattended.

Never leave your Christmas tree lights or outdoor decorative lights unattended. Be sure to unplug them when you go to bed or leave the house.

Another wise safety precaution is to check all outdoor and tree lights BEFORE you decorate. Discard strands with frayed wiring and replace burned out bulbs.

Avoid hanging ornaments on lights.

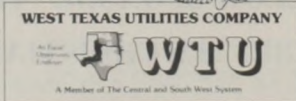
Make sure paper ornaments and tinsel do not touch light bulbs. Also, never adjust outdoor or tree lights while they are turned on or connected to a power circuit.

Always use a wooden ladder or a metal one with rubber-tipped legs when installing outdoor lights. Be sure to stand on a dry surface.

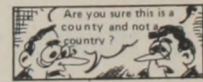
