At 3.50 p.m. Wednesday January 17, 1991 Operation Desert ert Storm as F15 E fiphter bombers left Saudi Amabia to head north to strike Iraq's strangle hold on Kuwait.
The United States and its allies began to engage targets in Kuwait so that Kuwait may be aimed at Saddam Hussein' military sites, the same sites he had used to conquer Kuwait, and Baghdad, capital of Iraq. On August 2, 1990, Saddam
Hussein took Kuwait over by Hussein took Kuwait over by force in defiance to being condemned by the rest of the world pressure which was ased to to to force him to withdraw from
Saddam Hussein also refused to make any compromises with war breaking Nations io preven war breaking out.
Therefore on January 17 heavily loaded aircraft shot off into thenight in pairs from Saudi Arabia to find their targets in Kuwait
