Birmingham, March 28. - Serious trouble was threatened Monday at the mines at Dolomite, where 350 miners armed themselves because those of their number were arrested Saturday night.

Sheriff O'Brien and a dozen deputies went to the scene and dispersed the negroes, the sheriff giving the rioters a severe talk.
