Twelve new Texas Agricultural
Diversification Matching Grants totaling $\$ 115,000$ have been awarded recently. The matching grants will be augmented by nearly ity studies, training programs and alternative crop and livestock demonstration projects throughout Texas. The 12 recipients were chofrom among 83 applicants. To date, 30 projects have re ceived $\$ 400,000$ in state matching grants, which have been augmented by approxamately $\$ 800,000$ in local
