

**Fisheries Habitat Improvement Study**

Improve a lake by throwing old automobile tires into the water?  
Yes. One man's litter may be another creature's home.  
The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department plans to take a look at a Tennessee Game and Fish Commission study which found it could concentrate catfish in small farm ponds by using old tires as cover.  
The same study also found that wooden stakes stuck into the bottom of old reservoirs attract crappie.  
Texas has its share of old lakes which have long since been devoid of hiding places for fish.  
Natural cover in most of the large reservoirs which are more than 20 years old has rotted away or been covered with silt.  
Lakes such as Lake Houston still support game fish but the angler has to cover a large area since the fish have no natural congregating spots.  
To replace the original cover would be economically impossible so the Parks and Wildlife Department will experiment with cover on a small scale in the Eagle Mountain Fish Hatchery and Benbrook Reservoir, both in Tarrant County.

The department does not plan to get into the cover-building business right away. Their first efforts are designed to determine which type of cover attracts which fish. The outcome of the study will help locally sponsored projects and help the Parks and Wildlife Department make recommendations to the U. S. Corps of Engineers and other reservoir constructing agencies.

By the project's completion date in 1975, the department should be able to establish a few oases on desolate lake bottoms.
