
IMPROVEMENTS FOR VALLEY TRANSLATOR SYSTEM CARRIES BY A LARGE MARGIN

Each customer of Valley Translator System was mailed a letter explaining improvements that could be made by the T.V. System with a monthly increase in dues of 75c. A card was enclosed so that each customer could express his views on this subject. With only 1 day to go, only 7% are not in favor of the improvements.

Therefore, we have told our engineer to make application to FCC in Washington for increase in power from 10 watts to 20 watts, immediately. Channel 10 will be the first improved by a very narrow margin over Channel 7. Channel 4 will be the last on the basis of cards returned to us. Equipment will be ordered and on hand so that when approval is received from FCC for this increase in power, they can be made without delay.

Thanks for your cooperation in this matter, and we believe it is a wise decision on your part.






