I have and will continue, if re-elected, to try to be responsive to the needs of the people in our county, to represent the entire county, and to welcome your input, both positive and negative, on any matter of which I have a part. The best way to have better elected officials is to let them know your concerns and what you like about their actions and, conversely, what you do not like about their actions. Constructive criticism should be welcomed by any elected official because it lets us know the ideas of our constituents on the operations of our county.

Once again, I ask for your vote in the upcoming primary election and thank you for your support in the past.
