This is the ordinary English Hawthorn tree, but legends say that it grew from the staff which Joseph of Arimathea thrust into the soil when he arrived in England as a missionary after the death of Christ. It grew, throve and thereafter came to blossom on Christmas Day. Cuttings from it resulted in other holy trees. Illnesses were cured by touching its leaves on Christmas Day. Merchants paid large sums for cuttings of this tree



Mistletoe has a Past

name from the Anglo-Saxon "mis-tletan," meaning "different twig" or "different tree." Its scientific name, when translated from greek, paints a pretty descriptive picture, too: 'Phoradendron,' from 'phor' (a thief) and 'dendron' (tree)

Old English legends tell us that mistletoe was originally a tree, but was banished for eternity as a humble and despised clinging parasite after its wood was used in the cross. Meanwhile, the Norse were dedicating mistletoe to Freya, their goddess of love, vowing never to let the mystical plant touch the impure ground. Obviously, we've picked up our customs of hanging mistletoe and seeking affection under it from the Norse.

There are over 100 species in North America of Mistletoe and 1,300 species in the world.

Regardless of the mistletoe species, it's noted for smothering and starving the very tree that feeds it.

The plants produce small sticky berries (poisonous) that stick on the feet of birds. On suitable sites, the seed soon sprouts, forming the root like haustoria for support and food gathering.

Kissing under the mistletoe became a custom derived from the ancient pagan marriage rite. The Druids in Gaul, Britain and Ireland, before the time of Christ, considered the mistletoe sacred. They not only encouraged kissing under it, but even crushed mistletoe and drank it as an aphrodisiac

These ancients believed the plant was a sign of peace and hope.







Legend Of The Christmas Tree

Most explanations concerning the origin of the Christmas tree are legendary. In Pre-Christian times the evergreen was worshipped, used

as a symbol of immortality and was thought to have various magical properties.

The Christmas tree as we think of it today orginated rather late and stems from Christian, rather than pagan, tradition. Though some scholars insistit was St. Boniface in

Germany, during the 8th century, the credit usually goes to Martin Luther, over 400 years ago. Stroll-ing home on a clear, star-lit Christmas Eve, the Reformation leader was inspired to cut a tall evergreen, place lighted candles on it to sym bolize the stars and give it to his

German settlers brought the tree custom to Pennsylvania during the 17th century. German born Prince Albert introduced it to England in 1841, a year after his marriage to Queen Victoria.

The first decorated trees in America were set up by homesick Hessian troops during the Revolutionary War. It was many years, however, before the custom itself

began. One of the first trees was set up by Charles Follen, a German professor at Harvard, in 1832.

President Franklin Pierce did much to spread the custom by having a Christmas tree in the White-House in the 1850's. President Benjamin Harrison continued the practice and soon the Christmas tree became an American tradition.

Not having provided for this delay in their journey, the cook threw everything he had to make one dish for all--thus the plum pudding!






