ord for hunting accidents as three hunters were killed and six were injured. Another man died in a boating accident during a hunt. Opening morning in Llano County a 48 year old man was shot in the chest with a .270
caliber rifle after his hunting partner mistook him for a key. The same day a 15 year old was mistaken for a deer and shot in Palo Pinto County. Also on opening day, one man died in Jasper County when he and two companions were walking back to their vehicle and one of the companion s gun discharge
The other death will be
counted as a boating accicdent, counted as a boating accicdent,
although it occurred during hunting trip opening day in Red River County. Three hunters, a man, his son and his grandson,

The National Farmers Union suggested that as a condition of a food aid package, the Soviets would have to spend a portion of their
military budget on improving food distribution.
