After attending Clarendon College, Stuart went on to get his bachelor's degree from Wichita State University and his juris doctorate from the University of Kansas.

After several years of practicing law in Topeka, Kansas, Stuart made the decision to re turn with his family to the Hall County/Hedley area. He and his wife, Kay Messer, opened their law practice in Memphis in December of 1994.

In announcing his candidacy, Stuart issued the following statement

I will prosecute crimes committed within my jurisdiction to the utmost of my legal abilities. I will also actively seek to assist all county officials needing legal advice on civil and criminal matters that affect the county and its residents.







are being accepted at the Farm Service Agency office located in Memphis Mollie F. Moffitt said today. Motley County is one of eight in Texas recently named by Sceretary of

Agriculture Dan Glickman eligible for loans to cover part of actual produ tion losses resulting from the flooding, hail, excessive rain, lightning, high winds, tornadoes and below normal temperatures.

Hall County is one of six in Texas recently named by Secretary of Ag-riculture Dan Glickman eligibile for loans to cover part of actual production losses resulting from the hail, high winds and tornado.

Mrs. Moffitt said farmers may be eligible for loans of up to 80 percent of their actual losses or the operating loan needed to continue in business or \$500,000, whichever is less. For farmers unable to obtain credit from private commercial lenders, the interest is 3.75 percent

"As a general rule, a farmer must have suffered at least a 30 percent loss of production to be eligible for an FSA emergency loan, " Mrs. Moffitt said. Farmers participating in the PIK or federal Crop Insurance program will have to figure in proceeds from those programs in determining their loss.

"Applications for loans under this emergency designation will be ac-cepted until June 10, 1996, but farmers should apply as soon as possible. Delays in applying could create backlogs in processing and possible over into the new farming season, "Mrs. Moffitt said. FSA is a credit agency of U.S. Department of Agriculture. It is author-ized to provide disaster emergency loans to recognized farmers who work ssing and possible over

Eligibility is extended to individual farmers who are U.S. citizens and to farming partnerships, corporations or cooperatives in which U.S. citizens hold a majority interest. The FSA office in Memphis is open from 8:00 A.M. to 5:00 P.M. Monday

Johnson said our role models also increase depressed feelings during the holidays



Saint Nicholas was a kindly man and jolly, and very rich. He loved to make mysterious journeys into the country and poor sections of the community to bring secret gifts to the poor. For a long time his identity remained hidden, but he was caught at last with his sack of gifts on his back.

Down The Chimney Saint Nicholas knew an old nobleman who was very poor and who did not want anyone to know of his poverty. Wishing to give him a gift of money Saint Nicholas crept to a window of the house and saw the old gentleman asleep by the fire.

The good Bishop climbed to the roof of the house and dropped his gift down the chimney, thinking it would fall on the hearth at the nobleman's feet.

However, it so happened that the gentleman's daughter had hung some stockings to dry by the fire and the money fell into one of them. From this kindly deel of the good Bishop has grown the wide-spread custom of hanging stock-ings at Christmas time.

Died In 1087 The anniversary of Saint Nicho-las' death in 1087 eventually be-came a festival in the Russian church, and in time the name be-came corrupted to Santa Claus and associated with the festivities of the Christmas season, with its tree, its decorations, the holly and the mistletoe.

Beef Teleconference

by; Rebel Royall On Tues., Dec. 12, beef producers across Texas and around the country will have an opportunity to participate in a satellite teleconfer ence, hosted the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas Beef Council and Texas Farm Bureau. The "interactive" format offers

producers the opportunity to ask questions or make comments either by calling or faxing information direct to the broadcast studios at Texas A&M University in College Station Texas A&M's research and ex-

tension center at 6500 Amarillo Boulevard West will be one local area site where producers can attend in person. Registration at the Center will begin at 8:00 a.m. The teleconference begins at 8:30 a.m. and ends by 1 p.m. Texas Farm Bureau offices with satellite capabilities will host producers who come to their locations. Superior Livestock Auction, Inc. will be carrying the program on its network which goes to sites throughout North America.

"Anyone can access this pro-gram," says Ted McCollum, Extension beef cattle specialist at Amarillo. Producers can stay at their businesses or homes and still receive the information, if they have a satellite dish.

The conference theme is beef cattle production practices that impact beef quality and consistency. It will offer an industry-wide perspective and features beef cattle producers, consultants and animal scientists who will discuss the major issues involving beef quality and value, says McCollum.

Targeting beef quality defini-tions, Texas A&M's Bill Miles, animal science professor at College Station will introduce comments by recognized industry leaders including Tio Kleberg of the King Ranch, Harlan Huffman, past chairman, Texas Beef Council, Jeanne Sowa, member of the National Livestock and Meat Board and Ken Jordan, ******

Other additional holiday safety

John McNeill, Ex-tension beef cattle program leader and director of the Ranch to Rail program will discuss how the animal health adds value in calf pro-duction. Extension livestock specialist, Ron Gill of Dallas will describe proper injection techniques and animal identification practices. The final segment will feature

improving value and quality of calves through genetics. Speakers having regional ties to the Panhandle include West Texas A&M's Ted Montgomery of Canyon and Minnie Lou Bradley, owner of the B3R Ranch in Memphis, among others



Hanfling says to pay close attention to the age specifications on the packages of toys when shopping. Before allowing the child to play with any toy, check for broken pieces that could be swallowed or sharp edges that could cause injuries.
