She is very proud of the van, and attact. and states "it's much more convenient for the senior citizens to board, not to mention the comfort."

"The Panhandle Transit community bus is not a senior citizens bus, although some may think so", she says, Those who qualify for at least one government pro-gram can ride with no fee. Those who do not qualify pay 25 cents a mile on out of town trips or 50 cents a mile in town. There are requirements for riding on the van, and appointments must be scheduled 24 hours in advance and are taken on a first call basis. Appointments can be made by calling City Hall in Turkey, 423-1033, and if possible, call a few days in advance to insure a ride.

Requirements are: 1. Must be on a government program, 2. Give your social security 3.Medicaid number must be number given, as well as the doctors name and address and/or drug store. Medicaid trips for doctors appointments and medicine only.

Donations may be made to Panhandle Transit, and are matched by the government, as well as volunteer services.
