The centerpiece of the small business bill is a provision increasing the expense election for equipment made by small
business. Currently, businesses can deduct up to $\$ 17,500$ of equipment costs in the year of purchase. That limit will be raised to $\$ 18,000$ in 1997 and then gradually increased to $\$ 25,000$
by The bill increases the minimum wage to
$\$ 4.75$ effective October 1 , 1996, with an addi$\$ 4.75$ effective October 1,1996 , with an addi ber 1, 1997 .
A group of expired tax breaks were extended by the bill. Some of the rules that apply to Scor porations will change, including an increase in he number of shareholders allowed
The bill also delays for six months the effective date for full implementation of th deposits electronically. Employers who depos ited more than $\$ 50,000$ in taxes in 1995 wer scheduled to begin electronic deposits by Janu ary 1, 1997. That deadline has been moved to
July 1, 1997. uly $1,1997$. Beginning in 1997 , deductible IRA contribu-
tions of up to $\$ 2,000$ will be allowed for each spouse (including a homemaker who does no work outside the home) if the combined compensation of both spouses is at least equal to the contributed amount and the contribution therwise qualify.
