

According to first reports, the new process will conreports, the new process will con-sume only about 20 pounds of sul-phuric acid per ton of cottonseed delinted. Backers of the operation say the quality of the seed will be improved, with no deterioration of the seed coat and with water up-take levels during germination equivalent to gin run seed.
